

PRESS RELEASE

The California Law Revision Commission met in San Francisco on Friday and Saturday, September 16 and 17. The meeting was held at the time of the State Bar Convention and a portion of the meeting on Friday was devoted to receiving suggestions from members of the Bench and Bar concerning matters deserving of study by the Commission.

The Law Revision Commission, established in 1954, was created by the Legislature to make a continuing study of California law and to recommend, from time to time, legislative measures necessary to bring the law into harmony with modern conditions. The Commission consists of one Member of the Senate, one Member of the Assembly, seven members appointed by the Governor, and the Legislative Counsel, who is an ex officio nonvoting member.

Mr. Thomas E. Stanton, Jr. of San Francisco is Chairman of the Commission and Mr. John Babbage of Riverside is its Vice-Chairman. Senator Jess Dorsey of Bakersfield and Assemblyman Clark L. Bradley of San Jose are the legislative members. The other members of the Commission are Mr. Joseph A. Ball of Long Beach, Mr. Bert W. Levit of San Francisco, Mr. Stanford Shaw of Ontario, Mr. John Swan of Sacramento and Professor Samuel D. Thurman of the Stanford Law School.

The Law Revision Commission welcomes suggestions of California judges and lawyers as to problems of California law which may warrant study. Suggestions may be sent to Mr. John R. McDonough, Jr., the Executive Secretary of the Commission, whose address is School of Law, Stanford, California.
