Subject: Request of Professor Van Alstyne To Publish
Claims Study.

The attached letter from Professor Van Alstyne, our consultant on the study relating to claims against public officers and employees, requests authority to publish this study in a law review.

The standard contract form of the Law Revision Commission provides:

Contractor agrees that his study and report shall become the sole property of the State and that he shall not publish the report or otherwise use it except upon the written authorization of the Chairman of the Law Revision Commission.

In January 1959 the Commission adopted the policy that a research consultant is not permitted to publish his work for the Commission as a law review article or otherwise prior to publication of the report by the Commission. Since the claims study has already been published by the Commission, this request should be approved by the Commission in accordance with its established policy.
