Memorandum to Law Revision Conmission
Subject: Budget for 1957-58

Mr. Stephani of the Department of Finance has requested us to submit our budget for 1957-58 as soon as possible.

Attached is a proposed budget for 1957-58, showing comparative figures for each of our prior years of operation, together with a brief statement relating to the items for 1957-58.


1. SALARIES AND WAGES.

Cormission Kembers (7) per diem ( $\$ 2,000$ ): This item has been reduced by $\$ 1,360$ in view of the fact that per diem charges have run considerably less than estimated in previous years.

Executive Secretary ( $\$ 6,900$ ): Same as for 1956-57.
Assistant Counsel ( $\$ 6,060$ ): This figure is Iixed on the assumption that we will establish the Assistant Counsel position as of November 1, 1956 and fill it imnediately; thus the salary will be $\$ 505$ for the first four months of fiscal year 1957-58 and $\$ 530$ for the remaining eight months.

Junior Counsel ( $\$ 4,980$ ): This Pigure is fixed at the beginaing rate for the Junior Counsel position on the assumption that the position will not be filled until the beginning of 1957-58.

Senior Legal Stenographer ( $\$ 4,780$ ): This Pigure takes into account regular increases in the pay for this position.

Intermediate Stenographer-Clerk ( $\$ 3,484$ ): This figure is fixed on the assumption that we will begin a fuli time Intermediate Stenographer-clerk as of November 1, 1956; thus the rate will be $\$ 281$ for the first four months of 1957-58 and \$295 for the remaining eight months.

## 2. OPERATITG EXXEYSES.

Office ( $\$ 1,000$ ): This figure has been increased to $\$ 1,000$ because our expenses in 1955-56 were alnost that much.

Printing and Binding ( $\$ 6,000$ ): This figure is based on the assumption that the recommendations made in my memorandum on printing of reports will be accepted.

Traveling-in-State ( $\$ 4,000$ ): This figure is reduced from $\$ 8,540$ because our travel expense in 1954-55 and 1955-56 ran considerably less than we had anticipated.

Traveling-out-of-State ( $\$ 500$ ): This figure is the same as for 1956-57.
Telephone and Telegraph. (a) Exchange charges (\$265): This figure has been increased slightiy to cover charges at the present rate. (b) Long Distance ( $\$ 300$ ): This is the same as for 1956-57.

Postage ( $\$ 350$ ): This figure has been reduced from $\$ 500$ because expenses have min less than anticipated.

Research Services ( $\$ 25,000$ ): This is a rough estimate for present purposes based on the assumption that the commission will recommend approximately fifteen topics and that most of them will be somewhat broader in scope than topics in previous years so that the cost of research will average about $\$ 1,000$ per topic. The 1956-57 figure was based on the assumption that research would cost approximately $\$ 800$ per topic.

Subscriptions ( $\$ 300$ ): This is slightly larger than the cost of subscriptions in 1955-56 on the assuaption that other members of the conmission may desire subscriptions in future years.
3. EQUIPMEITI.

Office - sdditional ( $\$ 550$ ): This item assumes that the position of Assistant Counsel will be established and includes $\$ 300$ for the purpose of buying office equipment for an additional person. It also includes $\$ 250$ for files which we find we must acquire at a rate of approximately two per year.
