Supplement to Memorandum No. 63 (1960)

Subject: 1961 Annual Report

1. At the July 1960 meeting a motion was adopted that dissents to Commission recommendations not be indicated in the recommendation submitted to the Legislature and that a statement be added to the Annual Report to indicate that this is the Commission's policy.

The following statement is submitted for the Commission's consideration. It might be added as a footnote to the second sentence of the fifth paragraph on page 3 of the 1961 Annual Report (Memorandum No. 63(1960)).

In some instances one or more members of the Commission may dissent to all or part of a recommendation submitted to the Legislature by the Commission. The established practice of the Commission is that these dissents are not indicated in its recommendation to the Legislature.

2. Section 10331 of the Government Code provides:

The Commission shall recommend the express repeal of all statutes repealed by implication, or held unconstitutional by the Supreme Court of the State or the Supreme Court of the United States.

Pursuant to this directive we have heretofore read the advance sheets of the reports of the California Supreme Court and the United States Supreme Court and reported decisions handed down, since the Commission was established, holding California statutes unconstitutional. No search has been made for

earlier decisions holding California statutes unconstitutional.

The Commission has, from time to time, discussed whether a systematic search for such decisions should be undertaken. In the past the feeling has been that the time and effort required for such a search was not justified in view of the other assignments of the Commission. Periodically, Ralph Kleps has submitted a list of all California statutes which Shepard's California Citations indicates have been held unconstitutional. Attached as Exhibit I is the latest such list. It is presented at this time, together with Mr. Kleps' letter of transmittal, for your information and consideration in connection with the 1961 Annual Report.

- 3. The first sentence of the paragraph designated "(3)" on page 11 of the 1961 Annual Report should be revised to read:
 - (3) Two decisions of the Supreme Court of California holding statutes of the State unconstitutional in part have been found.

The following paragraph should be added at the end of page 11 of the 1961 Annual Report:

In Forster Shipbuilding Co. v. County of Ios Angeles, 41 the Supreme Court unanimously held the first paragraph of Section 107.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code invalid on the ground that under Section 14 of Article XIII of the California Constitution the Legislature does not have the power to declare a possessory interest arising out of a lease of exempt property to be personal property within the meaning of that section.

On page 12 of the 1961 Annual Report, delete the period at the end of the second paragraph and add: "and the repeal of the first paragraph of Section 107.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code."

4. On page 6 of the 1961 Annual Report, the underscored material will appear in boldface type in the printed report.

On page 7 of the 1961 Annual Report, the heading "Other Studies in Progress" will appear in boldface type in the printed report and will be in the same form as the comparable boldface heading on page 6.

The underscored material on pages 7 and 8 of the 1961 Annual Report will appear as italics in the printed report.
