Memorandum No. 106 (1960)

Subject: Determination of Commission Bills to be Introduced in Assembly and in Senate.

If both of the legislative members of the Commission are present at the December meeting of the Commission, the Commission should determine which of its bills should be introduced in the Assembly and which should be introduced in the Senate.

The following recommendations will be made to the 1961 Legislature:

(1) Inter Vivos Marital Property Rights in Property Acquired While Domiciled Elsewhere.

(2) Rescission of Contracts.

(3) Presentation of Claims Against Public Officers and Employees.

(4) Survival of Actions.

(5) Arbitration.

(6) The Right to Counsel and the Separation of the Delinquent from the Nondelinquent Minor in Juvenile Court Proceedings. (Should this be introduced in same House as the package presented by the Governor's Special Study Commission on Juvenile Justice?)

(7) Notice of Alibi (unless this recommendation is revised as proposed by the staff in which case there is a question as to whether any legislation on this topic should be introduced by the Commission).

(8) Evidence in Eminent Domain Proceedings.

(9) Reimbursement for Moving Expenses When Property is Acquired For Public Use.

(10) Taking Possession and Passage of Title in Eminent Domain Proceedings.
