4. The following matters relating to the Uniform Commercial Code have also been before your Committee:

The suggestion of the California Law Revision Commission that California Code Section 2209(2) be amended by deleting the present provision "a written contract within this division may only be modified by a written agreement or by an oral agreement fully executed by both parties" and that there be substituted therefor the following language: "A signed agreement which includes modification or rescission except by a signed writing cannot be otherwise modified or rescinded, but except as between merchants, such a requirement on a form supplied by the merchant must be separately signed by the other party." The substituted provision is the language of the Uniform Commercial Code as in effect generally throughout the United States.

One-half of your Committee is opposed to the change for the same reasons that it was opposed to the inclusion of the uniform provisions heretofore.*

The other one-half of your Committee is willing to approve the change primarily upon the basis of the desirability of uniformity with the law of other states.
