#### Memorandum 78-10

Subject: Compensation of Members of Law Revision Commission

The attached memorandum from Senator Alquist's office requests a statement of the Law Revision Commission's position on Senate Bill 1305, a proposal to provide for a uniform \$50 per meeting day compensation for members of boards and commissions. (The bill includes an amendment to Government Code Section 10302, relating to the Law Revision Commission.) The Commission's own proposal, which Senator Deukmejian has agreed to introduce, calls for \$50 per meeting day plus \$12.50 per hour for preparation time for not exceeding eight hours per meeting.

A copy of Senate Bill 1305 is attached. Also attached is a copy of a letter I wrote to Senator Alquist's office in response to the attached memorandum.

What position does the Commission wish to take on Senate Bill 1305?

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

Dear Mr. Maccarone:

You requested a statement of the position of the Law Revision Commission on Senate Bill 1305 (Compensation of Members of State Boards and Commissions). The Commission has not had an opportunity to review the bill. I will bring it to the attention of the Commission at its February 2-3 meeting and will advise you thereafter of the views of the Commission concerning the bill. The estimated cost of Senate Bill 1305 for the Law Revision Commission would be approximately \$3,600 per fiscal year.

You will be interested to know that the Commission some time ago prepared a draft of a bill to increase the compensation for members appointed by the Governor to \$50 for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Commission and, in addition, \$12.50 for each hour actually spent in preparation for a Commission meeting with a limitation that not more than eight hours of preparation time for each meeting shall be so compensated. The proposed amendment is drawn from Section 30314 of the Public Resources Code, which provides the per diem and preparation time compensation for the California Coastal Commission and the regional coastal commissions. Senator George Deukmejian, the Senate member of the Law Revision Commission, has agreed to introduce the bill drafted by the Commission. In connection with the Commission's proposal, I am enclosing background material on the need for the bill.

## Introduced by Senator Alquist

## January 3, 1978

An act to amend Section 103 of the Business and Professions Code, Section 103 of the Fish and Game Code, Sections 8894, 10302, and 13902 of the Government Code, Section 1152 of the Harbors and Navigation Code, Section 11770 of the Insurance Code, Sections 72, 1179, and 3070 of the Labor Code, Section 68 of the Military and Veterans Code, Section 5088 of the Penal Code, Section 10003 of the Unemployment Insurance Code, Sections 190 and 8552 of the Water Code, and Section 10701 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to compensation of members of state boards and commissions.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1305, as introduced, Alquist. State boards and commissions: compensation.

Existing law provides for compensation or payment of per diem and expenses, or both, of the members of various boards and commissions.

This bill would revise the amounts of compensation, or per diem and expenses, or both, payable to members of various specified boards and commissions.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

## The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 103 of the Business and
- 2 Professions Code is amended to read:
- 3 103. Each member of a board, commission, or
- 4 committee created in the various chapters of Division 2
- 5 (commencing at Section 500) and Division 3
- 6 (commencing at Section 5000), and in Chapter 2

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1 (commencing at Section 18600) and Chapter 3 2 (commencing at Section 19000) of Division 8, shall 3 receive the moneys specified in this section when 4 authorized by the respective chapters.

Each such member shall receive a per diem of 6 twenty/five dellars (\$25) fifty dollars (\$50) for each day actually spent in the discharge of official duties, and he 8 shall be reimbursed for his traveling and other expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of his duties.

Such payments in each instance shall be made only 11 from the fund from which the expenses of the agency are paid and shall be subject to the availability of money in 13 that fund.

14 SEC. 2. Section 103 of the Fish and Game Code is 15 amended to read:

103. Each of the commissioners shall receive ten 17 dollars (\$10) fifty dollars (\$50) for each day of actual 18 service performed in carrying out his official duties 19 pursuant to law, but the amount of such compensation 20 shall not exceed for any one commissioner the sum of fifty 21 dellars (850) two hundred dollars (\$200) for any one 22 calendar month. In addition to such compensation the 23 commissioners shall receive their actual and necessary 24 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

The compensation and expenses provided in this 26 section shall be paid out of the Fish and Game Preservation Fund.

SEC. 3. Section 8894 of the Government Code is amended to read:

8894. The members of the Seismic Safety Commission 31 shall serve without compensation but shall be paid per diem expenses of fifty dollars (\$50) for each day's 33 attendance at a meeting of the commission, plus actual 34 necessary travel expenses as determined by the State 35 Board of Control.

36 SEC. 4. Section 10302 of the Government Code is 37 amended to read:

38 10302. The members of the commission shall serve 39 without compensation, except that each member appointed by the Governor shall be paid a per diem of

twenty dellars (820) fifty dollars (850) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the commission. In addition, each member shall be allowed actual expenses incurred in the discharge of his duties, including travel expenses. SEC. 5. Section 13902 of the Government Code is

amended to read:

13902. If the third member is not a state officer acting ex officio, such member shall receive fifty dollars (\$50) for every day of actual attendance at meetings of the board not in excess of eight four meetings per month, together with necessary traveling expenses in attending such meetings.

SEC. 6. Section 1152 of the Harbors and Navigation 13 14 Code is amended to read:

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The members of the board shall receive as 16 compensation for their services such amount as may from time to time be determined by the board not exceeding 18 three hundred dollars (\$300) five hundred dollars (\$500) 19 each per month nor in the aggregate for all members of the board during any one month more than the amount of moneys received during that month pursuant to the provisions of Section 1167 of this code. They, and the officers and employees of the board shall be allowed their actual necessary expenses in the performance of their duties.

SEC. 7. Section 11770 of the Insurance Code is amended to read:

11770. The State Compensation Insurance Fund is continued in existence, to be administered by its board of directors for the purpose of transacting workmen's compensation insurance, and insurance against the expense of defending any suit for serious and willful misconduct, against an employer or his agent, and 34 insurance to employees and other persons of the compensation fixed by the workmen's compensation laws for employees and their dependents. Any appropriation made therefrom or thereto before the effective date of 38 this code shall continue to be available for the purposes for which it was made.

The board of directors of the State Compensation

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1 Insurance Fund is composed of the Director of Industrial 2 Relations, who is chairman thereof, and four members 3 who shall be appointed by the Governor. The term of 4 office of the members of the board, other than that of the 5 director, shall be four years and they shall hold office until the appointment and qualification of their successors. The terms of the first four members so appointed shall expire as follows: one on January 15, 1946; one each on 9 January 15, 1947, January 15, 1948, and January 15, 1949. 10 Each member shall receive his actual and necessary 11 traveling expenses incurred in the performance of his 12 duty as a member and, except the Director of Industrial 13 Relations, twenty/five dollars (\$25) fifty dollars (\$50) for 14 each day of his actual attendance at meetings of the 15 board. In order to qualify for membership on the board, 16 each member other than the director shall have been a policyholder or the employee of a policyholder in the 18 State Compensation Insurance Fund for one year prior to his appointment, and must continue in such status during 20 the period of his membership.

SEC. 8. Section 72 of the Labor Code is amended to read:

One of the members of the Industrial Welfare 72. Commission may be appointed Chief of the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement. The members of the commission, other than the member who is appointed Chief of the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement, shall receive twenty/five dellars (\$25) fifty dollars (\$50) for each day's actual attendance at meetings of the commission and shall receive their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

SEC. 9. Section 1179 of the Labor Code is amended to 33 read:

1179. The members of the wage board shall be allowed fifteen dollars (\$15) fifty dollars (\$50) per diem and necessary traveling expenses while engaged in such conferences. The commission shall make rules governing the number and selection of the members and the mode of procedure of the wage board, and shall exercise exclusive jurisdiction over all questions as to the validity

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of the procedure and of the recommendations thereof. SEC. 10. Section 3070 of the Labor Code is amended 3 to read:

The Governor shall appoint a California 3070. Apprenticeship Council, composed of six representatives each from employer and employee organizations, respectively, geographically selected, and of two representatives of the general public. The Director of Industrial Relations and the Superintendent of Public 10 Instruction, or his permanent and best qualified designee, and the Chancellor of the California 12 Community Colleges, or his permanent and best 13 qualified designee, shall also be members of the 14 California Apprenticeship Council. The chairman shall 15 be elected by vote of the California Apprenticeship 16 Council. The terms of office of the members of the 17 California Apprenticeship Council first appointed shall 18 expire as designated by the Governor at the time of making the appointment: Two representatives each of 20 employers, employees, and the public representative shall serve until January 15, 1941. Two representatives 22 each of the employers and employees shall serve until 23 January 15, 1942. Thereafter each member shall serve for 24 a term of two years. Any member appointed to fill a 25 vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term of 26 his predecessor shall be appointed for the remainder of said term. Each member of the council shall receive the 28 sum of twenty/five dollars (\$25) fifty dollars (\$50) for each day of his actual attendance at meetings of the 30 council, for each day of his actual attendance at hearings by the council or a committee thereof pursuant to Section 3082, and for each day of his actual attendance at meetings of other committees established by the council and approved by the Director of Industrial Relations, together with his actual and necessary traveling expenses 36 incurred in connection therewith.

The terms of the five additional members provided by the amendment of this section at the 1955 Regular Session shall expire, as designated by the Governor at the time of making the appointment, as follows: One additional

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representative each of employers, employees, and the additional public representative shall serve until January 3 15, 1957; and one additional representative each of 4 employers and employees shall serve until January 15, 5 1958.

SEC. 11. Section 68 of the Military and Veterans Code is amended to read:

68. Each member of the board shall receive for each day's attendance at each meeting of the board a per diem 10 of twenty dollars (\$20) fifty dollars (\$50) and shall receive the same per diem for each day spent on official 12 duties assigned by the board. In addition, each member shall be reimbursed for his necessary traveling and other 14 expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties.

SEC. 12. Section 5088 of the Penal Code is amended 17 to read:

5088. The members of the Correctional Industries 19 Commission other than the chairman shall receive a per diem of twenty/five dollars (\$25) fifty dollars (\$50) for each day they are engaged in the official business of the commission, including time spent in traveling, for not more than 20 days in each fiscal year. All members, including the chairman, shall also receive their actual and necessary expenses of travel incurred in attending 26 meetings of the commission and in making investigations, either as a commission or individually as members of the commission at the request of the chairman.

SEC. 13. Section 10003 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:

10003. The members of the board shall serve without compensation, except that each member shall be paid a per diem allowance of twenty/five dollars (\$25) fifty 34 dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the 35 board, not to exceed six days in any month. The members of the board shall also receive their actual and necessary traveling expenses incurred in the course of their duties.

38 SEC. 14. Section 190 of the Water Code is amended to 39 read:

40 190. Whenever the State of California is specifically )

invited by federal law to participate in any interstate commission to plan for the regional development of water and related resources, the Governor shall appoint each California member of such commission. The appointment of each such member shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate, and the member appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

The provisions of this section shall also apply to the Western States Water Council established by the 10 Western Governors' Conference at its meeting in 11 Portland, Oregon, in June 1965.

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Each member appointed by the Governor to the 13 Western States Water Council shall receive the actual and necessary expenses incurred by him in the performance of his duties as a member, including travel expenses. Additionally, each such member, except persons who are officers or employees of the state, shall 18 receive a compensation of twenty/five dollars (\$25) fifty 19 dollars (\$50) for each day such member is engaged in the 20 performance of his duties as a member. Such expenses 21 and compensation shall be paid from the budget of the Department of Water Resources.

The provisions of this section do not in any manner 24 affect the provisions of Section 123 which provide for state administration of interstate compacts relative to the distribution and use of the waters of any interstate streams or bodies of water.

SEC. 15. Section 8552 of the Water Code is amended to read:

8552. Each member of the board shall receive the 31 necessary expenses incurred by him in the performance of his duties, and each member of the board that is neither eligible for nor receives any salary or other 34 compensation for time spent attending meetings of the 35 board shall receive fifty dollars (\$50) for each day attending the meetings of the board, but such per diem shall not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) three thousand dollars (\$3,000) in any one year.

In addition to the amounts above provided, any 40 member of the board traveling outside the state pursuant to authorization of the board, and the approval of theGovernor and Director of Finance as provided by Section

3 11032 of the Government Code, while so engaged shall 4 receive such per diem and his necessary expenses.

5 SEC. 16. Section 10701 of the Welfare and Institutions 6 Code is amended to read:

7 10701. The members of the board shall serve without 8 compensation, except that each member shall be paid a 9 per diem of twenty/five dollars (\$25) fifty dollars (\$50) 10 for each day's attendance at a meeting of the board, not 11 to exceed six days in any month. The members of the

12 board shall also receive their actual and necessary

13 traveling expenses incurred in the course of their duties.

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
