Subject: Study L-3014 - Uniform Custodial Trust Act

Attached is a letter from Assembly Member Byron Sher. He recommends that the Commission consider the adoption of the Uniform Custodial Trust Act as a part of the overall review of California probate law.

This Uniform Act is now listed on the "back burner" of probate matters to be considered when work on the new Probate Code is substantially complete. The staff has planned to start staff work on this Uniform Act within the next month or so.

Should we advise Assembly Member Sher that the Commission will soon be reviewing the Uniform Act with a view to determining whether the Commission will recommend its enactment in California?


Dear John:
