Study L-3010 - Notice of Trustees' Fees

Dear Mr. Sterling:

The Executive Committee of the Probate and Trust Law Section of the Los Angeles County Bar Association has reviewed the Tentative Recommendation relating to Study L-3010 and has requested that I convey their comments.

In particular, we agree that the affected interest requirement, set forth in existing Probate Code Section 15686(b), is ambiguous and has placed a significant burden on trust companies to determine which beneficiaries' interests would be affected by an increase in trustees' fees. By amending the above section to provide that notice be given to 1) beneficiaries entitled to an account under Section 16062, 2) beneficiaries actually given the last preceding account, and 3) beneficiaries who make a written request, the burden on trust companies should be significantly reduced. We also agree that Section 15804(a)(1) should be revised to clarify that accounts and reports are included in the "virtual representation" section and that such section applies in nonjudicial proceedings.

Accordingly, we support the Tentative Recommendation relating to Study L-3010 as proposed.
