Second Supplement to Memorandum 2000-32

Expired Pilot Projects (Draft Tentative Recommendation)

Memorandum 2000-32 presents a draft tentative recommendation proposing the repeal of statutes establishing pilot projects that have expired. We have received a letter from the Committee on Administration of Justice of the State Bar, commenting on the draft tentative recommendation. The Committee supports the changes proposed and recommends that the draft be circulated as a tentative recommendation. As the Committee states:

provisions relating to expired pilot projects cause clutter in the law and thereby threaten mischief, to the detriment of the administration of justice without any likely good. Their repeal, accordingly, will clear up such clutter and prevent such mischief, to the benefit of the administration of justice without any likely evil.

The Committee's letter also includes numerous comments on the details of the draft tentative recommendation. If the draft is approved by the Commission for circulation as a tentative recommendation, the Committee's letter will be attached to a memorandum discussing public comments regarding the tentative recommendation.
