

Memorandum 2001-27

Criminal Sentencing Statutes (Draft Tentative Recommendation)

The Commission is proposing a nonsubstantive reorganization of statutes providing sentence enhancements for crimes involving weapons and injuries. A staff draft tentative recommendation is attached. If the Commission approves the draft, it will be circulated for public comment. A few issues relating to the draft are discussed below. All statutory references in this memorandum are to the Penal Code.

Effect of Reenactment

“When a statute has been construed by the courts, and the Legislature thereafter reenacts that statute without changing the interpretation put on that statute by the courts, the Legislature is presumed to have been aware of, and acquiesced in, the courts' construction of that statute.” *People v. Ledesma*, 16 Cal. 4th 90, 101 (1997). Considering the complexity and political sensitivity of sentencing law, it should perhaps be made clear that the proposed law is not intended to indicate legislative acceptance of any pre-existing judicial construction of the reorganized statutes. This could be achieved by adding language along the following lines to proposed Section 17501:

17501. (a) A provision of this title, insofar as it is substantially the same as a previously existing provision relating to the same subject matter, shall be construed as a restatement and continuation thereof and not as a new enactment, and a reference in a statute to the provision of this part shall be deemed to include a reference to the previously existing provision unless a contrary intent appears.

(b) Restatement and continuation of a provision in this title is not intended to ratify or abrogate any prior judicial interpretation of that provision.

Comment. ...

Subdivision (b) makes clear that mere restatement and continuation of a provision in this title does not indicate any legislative position regarding a prior judicial interpretation of the provision.

The language in subdivision (b) is similar to Comment language used in a previous recommendation to address concerns about legislative acquiescence.

The advantage of this approach is that it should dispel any concern that the proposed law would have the substantive effect of ratifying judicial interpretations of the reorganized provisions. One possible disadvantage of this approach is that it could create an inference that failure to use such language in other contexts indicates the Legislature's willingness to accept prior judicial interpretations. Another possible problem is overbreadth. The disclaimer rebuts the legislative acquiescence presumption where a provision is restated and continued in the title. This is appropriate for our proposed legislation, but may be inappropriate with respect to later additions to the title.

On balance, the language is probably beneficial. **The staff recommends** that the language be added to the tentative recommendation. A note could be added specifically inviting comment on whether the language is appropriate.

Conforming Revisions

The proposed draft reorganizes and renumbers the weapon and injury enhancement provisions. Numerous sections refer to the provisions that have been renumbered. The draft includes language to update these cross-references. These changes are technical and only one is worth mentioning. Existing 666.7 is intended to provide a nonsubstantive catalog of all sentence enhancement provisions. It contains cross-references to all of the provisions reorganized under the proposed law. In addition to correcting these cross-references, the proposed law also makes a few technical improvements:

Section Divided and Relocated

Section 666.7 currently consists of twenty subdivisions (which group enhancements with similar terms), with over 130 subordinate paragraphs. Under the proposed law, the subdivisions are recast as separate sections. See proposed Sections 17523.010-17523.120. This will significantly simplify use and maintenance of the catalog.

The section would also be relocated from its current location, in a title comprised of over 40 miscellaneous "General Provisions," to the "Catalog of Enhancements" article in the "Sentence Enhancements" title, a much more prominent location. It seems likely that more practitioners would discover the catalog in this location.

In a deviation from normal drafting conventions, the proposed law uses numerical paragraph numbering for what would ordinarily be lettered subdivisions. This was done to avoid any future use of double letter subdivisions (e.g., subdivision (aa)) where more than 26 enhancements with the same term exist. There are already two enhancement terms that are common to more than twenty enhancements. See Section 666.7(a) (23 one-year enhancements) & (d) (21 two-year enhancements). If the Commission prefers, the conventional subdivision lettering can be used instead.

Schedule Naming Scheme

Under Section 666.7, enhancements are listed in ascending order of severity, with those sharing a common term referred to as a single “schedule,” named after the subdivision in which they appear. Thus, all one-year enhancements are grouped in Section 666.7(a) and may be referred to as “Schedule A” enhancements. This system breaks down when new enhancement terms are created. For example, Section 12022.7(d) was added in 2000 to create a new enhancement of four, five, or six years. Section 666.7 does not presently include any enhancements with that term. It includes Schedule J (four years) and Schedule K (four, five, or 10 years). A new schedule must be created to refer to Section 12022.7(d). Should this schedule be placed at the end of the catalog and designated “Schedule U,” violating the ascending order scheme? Should it be placed in its proper position in the ascending order and designated “Schedule J.5,” (or some such)? Should it be placed in the proper ascending order position and designated “Schedule K,” with all of the following schedules renamed to avoid duplication? All of these solutions are awkward. Note that SB 205 (McPherson) (2001) would update Section 666.7 to correct errors and omissions. It uses the last approach — placing new schedules in ascending order and renaming following schedules to avoid duplication.

The proposed law attempts to eliminate the problems inherent in an alphabetical ascending order scheme by replacing it with a scheme that refers to the length of the sentence enhancement itself. Thus, one year enhancements are referenced as “Schedule 1,” enhancements with term of one, two, or three years are referenced as “Schedule 1-2-3,” etc. The simplicity of this system is disrupted slightly by the recent addition of an enhancement of a term of sixteen months, two years, or three years. See Section 186.33(b)(1). The proposed law refers to this enhancement as “Schedule 1 1/3-2-3.” See proposed Section 17523.030. A note

following Section 17523.010 solicits comments on the merits of the approach taken in the proposed law.

Possible Repeal

A simple solution to the technical problems posed by Section 666.7 would be to repeal it. The staff has spoken with practitioners who raised doubts about the usefulness of the section. They feel it is overly long, awkwardly organized, unknown to most practitioners, and difficult to maintain. The note following Section 17523.010 solicits feedback on whether it might be best to repeal the section.

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1 CRIMINAL SENTENCING: REORGANIZATION
2 OF WEAPON AND INJURY ENHANCEMENTS

3 The California Law Revision Commission recommends a nonsubstantive
4 reorganization of statutes providing sentence enhancements for crimes involving
5 weapons and injuries. This reorganization will make it easier to locate applicable
6 enhancements and will establish a structure for better organization of sentencing
7 provisions in the future.

8 **Existing Law**

9 Felony sentencing is governed by a complex array of statutes and rules of court.¹
10 For the most part, felonies are subject to determinate sentencing provisions, under
11 which fixed terms of imprisonment are specified for each offense.² Typically,
12 three different terms are specified,³ with the middle term imposed except in cases
13 of aggravation or mitigation.⁴ A felony violation may also be subject to a sentence
14 enhancement, which provides for an additional term of imprisonment in specified
15 circumstances.⁵ Rules governing repeat offenders,⁶ and consecutive terms⁷ add
16 considerably to the complexity.

1 **Problems Under Existing Law**

2 The sentencing laws have been criticized as too complex and difficult to
3 understand. In the words of one appellate opinion:⁸

4 [The] sentencing statutes are mind-numbingly complicated, and by virtue of continued
5 legislative tinkering, not likely to soon become any easier to apply. As the trial judge in this case
6 remarked: “I regard it as one of the principal credits to my professional career that I had nothing to
7 do with designing the determinate sentencing law.” Such frustration is widely spread. ... The
8 frequency with which both simple and vexatious sentencing questions are raised on appeal
9 strongly suggests that the Legislature can and should undertake with the help of bench and bar a
10 solid comprehensive overhaul of the system to help all potential defendants and the public
11 generally.

12 The complexity of sentencing law creates a number of problems. It makes the
13 process of calculating a sentence more difficult, adding to the burden on trial
14 judges: “The sentencing formulas are complex, inconsistent and confusing. A
15 judge is often required to complete a worksheet which can be more complicated
16 than an IRS form in order to calculate the proper sentence.”⁹ The complexity also
17 contributes to a significant rate of reversal on appeal. According to a Judicial
18 Council study, sentencing errors are the single greatest class of errors leading to
19 reversal. In the period studied, sentencing errors accounted for 55% of reversals in
20 criminal cases.¹⁰ If, as a result of the complexity of sentencing laws, a prosecuting
21 attorney fails to properly plead an applicable sentence enhancement at trial, the
22 error cannot be corrected on appeal — the defendant’s sentence will be shorter
23 than is mandated by law.¹¹

1 The complexity of the sentencing laws may also make it difficult for the
2 Legislature to assess whether a proposed sentencing provision is necessary (i.e., is
3 not duplicative of existing law), fairly proportional to other comparable sentences,
4 and well coordinated with existing sentencing statutes.

5 **Previous Reform Efforts**

6 In recent years, a number of attempts have been made to rationalize the
7 sentencing statutes. From 1988 to 1995, Senator Lockyer introduced a series of
8 bills to comprehensively reform the sentencing laws.¹² These efforts enjoyed
9 significant support.¹³ However, the bills would have done more than reorganize
10 and simplify the law. They would have made a number of substantive changes,
11 including changes to sentence lengths. These changes proved controversial and
12 none of the bills was successfully enacted.¹⁴ In 1997, Senator Lockyer introduced
13 legislation to make a number of less controversial reforms to sentencing laws.¹⁵
14 That effort was successful.¹⁶

15 In 1998, Penal Code Section 666.7 was added to create a nonsubstantive
16 statutory index of all sentence enhancement provisions, organized by length of
17 enhancement.¹⁷ In explaining the purpose of Section 666.7, Senator Schiff
18 writes:¹⁸

19 Over the years, the Legislature has found it expedient to sprinkle enhancements throughout the
20 statutes. This has made our sentencing formulas confusing and has twisted the actual intent of our
21 body of law which should be a balanced justice for all individuals. ...

22 Enhancements are also the most complex and chaotic provisions in the Penal Code. There are
23 over one hundred enhancements with nineteen different types of punishments. More so,
24 enhancements may be a single term, multiple terms, or even indeterminate. I think the Assembly
25 Committee on Public Safety's analysis on SB 58 says it best when it reads, "... most of the

1 complexities of current sentencing law are ... the result of the many and varied sentence
2 enhancements.”

3 Therefore, SB 1794 is a small but necessary step in the right direction. I imagine this legislation
4 will become an easy reference guide for members, staffers and judges to consult. But even more
5 importantly, it will allow us to consider sentencing enhancements based on proportionality.
6 Currently, pure economics and cold fiscal considerations determine how severe an enhancement
7 can be added to any piece of legislation. SB 1794 will bring much more fairness and objectivity to
8 the political process when we deliberate on future sentencing enhancements.

9 In 1999, two bills were introduced to reform weapon- and injury-related
10 sentence enhancements provisions.¹⁹ These bills would have slightly lengthened
11 some enhancement terms, eliminated redundant enhancements, and revised the
12 provisions to make the language clearer and more uniform. Both bills failed to
13 pass out of committee.

14 **Proposed Law**

15 Substantive reform of sentencing statutes is politically controversial and very
16 difficult to accomplish. The California Law Revision Commission recommends
17 that sentence enhancement provisions relating to crimes involving weapons and
18 injuries be reorganized, *without affecting their substance*.²⁰ This will simplify the
19 law by placing these provisions in a single location, organized by the nature of the
20 enhancement. Such a reorganization would make it easier for judges and attorneys
21 to locate applicable enhancements, streamlining the sentencing process and
22 reducing the likelihood of errors involving sentence enhancements. Establishment
23 of a single, well-organized location for sentence enhancements would also make it
24 easier for Legislators to coordinate any future sentencing changes with existing
25 law. The proposed law could also serve as a model for further reorganization.²¹

26 The Commission recognizes that changes to section numbers will impose certain
27 transitional costs as practitioners learn the new system, and will require use of
28 tables to correlate references to old section numbers with the new section numbers.
29 However, the Commission believes that reorganization would result in significant
30 benefits, as the reorganized provisions would be easier to use and maintain. The
31 Commission is particularly interested in receiving comments from judges and
32 practitioners on whether the benefits of the proposed reorganization would justify
33 any inconvenience that would result from section renumbering.

SEC. ____ . Part 6 (commencing with Section 17000) is added to the Penal Code, to read:

PART 6 . SENTENCING

TITLE 1 . GENERAL PROVISIONS

Penal Code § 17000. Legislative intent.

17000. The Legislature intends to reserve Sections 17000 to 17999, inclusive, for sentencing provisions.

Comment. Section 17000 is new. It indicates the Legislature’s intent to reserve a block of sections as a location for sections relating to criminal sentencing.

TITLE 4 . SENTENCE ENHANCEMENTS

CHAPTER 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1. Purpose of Title

Penal Code § 17500. Purpose of title

17500. (a) The purpose of this title is to provide a single location for sentence enhancements relating to weapons and injuries. This will make it easier for prosecutors, defense attorneys, and judges to determine which of the numerous enhancement provisions apply in a particular case.

(b) Sentence enhancements relating to weapons or injuries shall be located in this title.

(c) A failure to locate a sentence enhancement relating to weapons or injuries in this title has no effect on the validity or meaning of the sentence enhancement.

Comment. Section 17500 is new. It states the purpose of this title as the repository of sentence enhancements relating to weapons and injuries.

1 **Penal Code § 17501. Continuation of existing statutes**

2 17501. A provision of this title, insofar as it is substantially the same as a
3 previously existing provision relating to the same subject matter, shall be
4 construed as a restatement and continuation thereof and not as a new enactment,
5 and a reference in a statute to the provision of this part shall be deemed to include
6 a reference to the previously existing provision unless a contrary intent appears.

7 **Comment.** Section 17501 is a standard type of provision in the codes. See, e.g., Corp. Code §
8 2; Fam. Code § 2; Prob. Code § 2(a). See also Gov't Code §§ 9604 (construction of restatements
9 and continuations), 9605 (construction of amended statutory provision). The last clause makes
10 clear that a statutory reference to a new provision of this title includes a reference to the former
11 law from which it is drawn. Cf. Gov't Code § 9604 (reference to previously existing provision
12 deemed reference to restatement or continuation).

13 A number of terms and phrases are used in the Comments to the sections of this title to indicate
14 the sources of the sections and to describe how they compare with prior law. The following
15 discussion is intended to provide guidance in interpreting the terminology most commonly used
16 in the Comments.

17 (1) *Continues without change.* A new provision “continues” a former provision “without
18 change” if the two provisions are identical or nearly so. In some cases, there may be insignificant
19 technical differences, such as where a typographical error or punctuation is corrected without a
20 change in meaning. Some Comments may describe the relationship by simply stating that a new
21 provision “continues” or is “the same as” a former provision,

22 (2) *Continues without substantive change.* A new provision “continues” a former provision
23 “without substantive change” if the substantive law remains the same, but the language differs to
24 an insignificant degree. This may include revision of language to make a statute gender-neutral.

25 (3) *Restates without substantive change.* A new provision “restates” a former provision
26 “without substantive change” if the substantive law remains the same but the language differs to a
27 significant degree. Some Comments may describe the new provision as being the “same in
28 substance.”

29 (4) *Exceptions, additions, omissions.* If part of a former provision is “continued” or “restated,”
30 the Comment may say that the former provision is continued or restated, but also note the specific
31 differences as “exceptions to,” “additions to,” or “omissions from” the former provision.

32 (5) *Generalizes, broadens, restates in general terms.* A new provision may be described as
33 “generalizing,” “broadening,” or “restating in general terms” a provision of prior law. This
34 description means that a limited rule has been expanded to cover a broader class of cases.

35 (6) *New.* A provision is described as “new” where it has no direct source in prior statutes.

36 **Article 2. Definitions**

37 **Penal Code § 17505. Great bodily injury**

38 17505. As used in this title, “great bodily injury” means a significant or
39 substantial physical injury.

40 **Comment.** Section 17505 generalizes former Section 12022.7(e). This definition is consistent
41 with judicial interpretation of the phrase “great bodily injury” in statutes that do not define the
42 term. See, e.g., *People v. Richardson*, 23 Cal. App. 3d 403, 100 Cal. Rptr. 251 (1972); *People v.*
43 *Wells*, 14 Cal. App. 3d 348, 92 Cal. Rptr. 191 (1971). The definition is also consistent with
44 California jury instructions relating to statutes that use but do not define the phrase “great bodily
45 injury.” See Cal. Jury Instr. Crim. §§ 7.35, 9.36.5, 9.94, 12.55.7, 14.80, 14.82, 16.013 (6th ed.
46 2000).

Article 3. Selection of Term

2 **Penal Code § 17520. Middle term presumption**

3 17520. Pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 1170, if a sentence enhancement is
4 to be imposed and the statute specifies three possible terms, the court shall order
5 imposition of the middle term unless there are circumstances in aggravation or
6 mitigation of the crime. The court shall set forth on the record the facts and
7 reasons for imposing the upper or lower term.

8 **Comment.** Section 17520 generalizes former Sections 12021.5(a)-(b), 12022(c)-(d),
9 12022.2(a)-(b), 12022.3(b), 12022.4, 12022.5(a)(2) & (c), 12022.7(d), without substantive
10 change. This section restates part of Section 1170(b) without substantive change. See also *People*
11 *v. Hall*, 8 Cal. 4th 950, 981, 883 P.2d 974, 35 Cal. Rptr. 2d 432 (1994) (Section 1170 governs
12 sentence enhancements); Cal. R. Ct 4.428(b).

13 **Penal Code § 17521. Knowledge that firearm is stolen**

14 17521. In applying an enhancement under Section 17530, 17531, 17532, 17534,
15 17536, 17537, 17538, 17539, 17545, 17546, 17547, 17548, 17550, 17551, or
16 17552, the fact that a person knew or had reason to believe that a firearm was
17 stolen shall constitute a circumstance in aggravation justifying imposition of the
18 upper term.

19 **Comment.** Section 17521 restates former Section 1170.89 without substantive change.

Article 4. Catalog of Enhancements

21 **Penal Code § 17523.010. Purpose of article**

22 17523.010. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature that this article serve merely as a
23 nonsubstantive comparative reference of current sentence enhancement provisions.
24 Nothing in this article shall have any substantive effect on the application of any
25 sentence enhancement contained in any provision of law, including: omission of
26 any sentence enhancement provision, inclusion of any obsolete sentence
27 enhancement provision, or inaccurate reference or summary of a sentence
28 enhancement provision.

29 (b) It is the intent of the Legislature to amend this article as necessary to
30 accurately reflect current sentence enhancement provisions, including the addition
31 of new provisions and the deletion of obsolete provisions.

32 (c) For the purposes of this article, the term “sentence enhancement” means an
33 additional term of imprisonment in the state prison added to the base term for the
34 underlying offense. A sentence enhancement is imposed because of the nature of
35 the offense at the time the offense was committed or because the defendant
36 suffered a qualifying prior conviction before committing the current offense.

37 **Comment.** Section 17523.010 continues the introductory paragraphs of former Section 666.7
38 without substantive change.

1 ☞ **Note.** Penal Code Section 666.7 is intended to provide a nonsubstantive cross-reference to all
2 sentence enhancements. These enhancements are organized by the length of the enhancement;
3 grouped into alphabetically designated “schedules” in ascending order of length. Thus, one year
4 enhancements are designated “Schedule A,” one-, two-, or three-year enhancements are
5 designated “Schedule B,” etc. This scheme is inherently difficult to maintain. If a new
6 enhancement is created that does not match any of the existing schedules, it must either be placed
7 at the end (in which case the ascending order is not observed) or in ascending order (in which
8 case the alphabetical designations must be altered somehow to fit in a new schedule), or all of the
9 schedules must be renamed. This problem has already occurred. For example, Penal Code Section
10 12022.7(d) was added to create a new enhancement of four, five, or six years. In the ascending
11 order scheme, this falls between Schedule J (four years) and Schedule K (four, five, or 10 years).
12 A new schedule must be created to refer to Section 12022.7(d). Should it be designated “Schedule
13 U,” violating the ascending order, should it be placed in ascending order and designated
14 “Schedule J.5” or “Schedule J-2”, or should all of the schedules be renamed? All of these
15 solutions are awkward. Note that SB 205 (McPherson) would update Section 666.7 to correct
16 errors and add new references. It places the new schedules in ascending order and renames all of
17 them to preserve the alphabetical naming.

18 The proposed law attempts to eliminate the problems inherent in an alphabetical ascending
19 order scheme by replacing it with a scheme that refers to the length of the sentence enhancement
20 itself. Thus, one year enhancements are referenced in “Schedule 1,” one-, two-, or three- year
21 enhancements are referenced in “Schedule 1-2-3,” etc.

22 Another possibility that should be considered is repeal of the catalog provisions entirely. they
23 are very difficult to maintain and may not be useful to practitioners. Especially if all
24 enhancements are eventually gathered in one well-organized location, the need for a catalog of
25 the type found in Section 666.7 is doubtful. Another possibility would be to preserve the catalog,
26 but eliminate the schedule designations. It isn’t clear that creating schedule names is useful. The
27 Commission would like to receive comments regarding the approaches discussed above.

- 5 (8) Showing child pornography to a minor prior to or during the commission or
- 6 attempted commission of any lewd or lascivious act with the minor (Section
- 7 667.15(a)).
- 8 (9) Felony conviction of forgery, grand theft, or false pretenses as part of plan or
- 9 scheme to defraud an owner in connection with repairs to a structure damaged by a
- 10 natural disaster (Section 667.16(a)).

- 20 attempted commission of a felony (Section 17545(a)).
- 21 (14) Taking, damaging, or destroying any property in the commission or
- 22 attempted commission of a felony with the intent to cause that taking, damage, or
- 23 destruction when the loss exceeds fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) (Section
- 24 12022.6(a)(1)).
- 25 (15) Transferring, lending, selling, or giving any assault weapon to a minor
- 26 (17539).
- 27 (16) Manufacturing, causing to be manufactured, distributing, transporting,
- 28 importing, keeping for sale, offering or exposing for sale, giving, or lending any
- 29 assault weapon while committing another crime (Section 12280(e)).
- 30 (17) Inducing, employing, or using a minor to commit a drug offense involving
- 31 heroin, cocaine, or cocaine base, or unlawfully furnishing one of these controlled
- 32 substances to a minor, upon the grounds of, or within, a church, playground, youth
- 33 center, child day care facility, or public swimming pool during business hours or
- 34 whenever minors are using the facility (Health and Safety Code Section
- 35 11353.1(a)(1)).
- 36 (18) Inducing another person to commit a drug offense as part of the drug
- 37 transaction for which the defendant is convicted when the value of the controlled
- 38 substance involved exceeds five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) (Health and
- 39 Safety Code Section 11356.5(a)(1)).
- 40 (19) Manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, deriving, processing,
- 41 or preparing methamphetamine or phencyclidine (PCP), or attempting to commit
- 42 any of those acts, or possessing specified combinations of substances with the
- 43 intent to manufacture either methamphetamine or phencyclidine (PCP), when the

1 commission or attempted commission of the offense causes the death or great
2 bodily injury of another person other than an accomplice (Section 17575).

3 (20) Using a minor to commit a drug offense involving phencyclidine (PCP),
4 methamphetamine, or lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD), or unlawfully furnishing
5 one of these controlled substances to a minor, when the commission of the offense
6 occurs upon the grounds of, or within, a church, playground, youth center, child
7 day care facility, or public swimming pool during business hours or whenever
8 minors are using the facility (Health and Safety Code Section 11380.1(a)(1)).

9 (21) Possessing for sale, or selling, heroin, cocaine, cocaine base,
10 methamphetamine, or phencyclidine (PCP), when the commission of the offense
11 occurs upon the grounds of a public park, public library, or oceanfront beach
12 (Health and Safety Code Section 11380.5(a)(1)).

13 (22) Causing bodily injury or death to more than one victim in any one instance
14 of driving under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug (Section 17585).

15 (23) Fraudulently appropriating food stamps, electronically transferred benefits,
16 or authorizations to participate in the federal Food Stamp Program entrusted to a
17 public employee, or knowingly using, transferring, selling, purchasing, or
18 possessing, any of the same in an unauthorized manner, when the offense is

23 An erroneous reference to Section 12280(c) is corrected in paragraph (16). See Section 17505
24 (“great bodily injury” defined).

25 **Penal Code § 17523.020. Schedule 1-2-3**

26 17523.020. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
27 enhancement of one, two, or three years of imprisonment in the state prison may
28 be referenced as “Schedule 1-2-3.”

29 (1) Commission or attempted commission of a felony hate crime (Section
30 422.75(a)).

31 (2) Commission or attempted commission of a felony against the property of a
32 public or private institution because the property is associated with a person or
33 group of identifiable race, color, religion, nationality, country of origin, ancestry,
34 gender, disability, or sexual orientation (Section 422.75(b)).

35 (3) Felony conviction of unlawfully causing a fire of any structure, forest land,
36 or property when the defendant has been previously convicted of arson or
37 unlawfully causing a fire, or when a firefighter, peace officer, or emergency

35 except that former paragraph (1) has not been continued. This reflects the increase in the term of
36 enhancement under Section 186.22(b)(1). See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

37 **Penal Code § 17523.025. Schedule 1-2-5**

38 17523.025. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
39 enhancement of one, two, or five years of imprisonment in the state prison may be
40 referenced as “Schedule 1-2-5.”

41 (1) Wearing a bullet-resistant body vest in the commission or attempted
42 commission of a violent offense (Section 17533).

1 (2) Commission or attempted commission of any specified sex offense while
2 armed with a firearm or deadly weapon (Section 17538).

3 **Comment.** Section 17523.025 continues former Section 666.7(c) without substantive change.

4 **Penal Code § 17523.030. Schedule 1 1/3-2-3**

5 17523.030. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
6 enhancement of sixteen months, two years, or three years imprisonment in the
7 state prison may be referenced as “Schedule 1 1/3-2-3.”

8 (1) Knowing failure to register pursuant to Section 186.30 and subsequent
9 conviction or violation of Section 186.30, as specified (Section 186.33(b)(1)).

10 **Comment.** Section 17523.030 is new.

11 **Penal Code § 17523.035. Schedule 2**

12 17523.035. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
13 enhancement of two years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced
14 as “Schedule 2.”

15 (1) Money laundering when the value of the transactions exceeds one hundred
16 fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000), but is less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000)
17 (Section 186.10(c)(1)(B)).

18 (2) Commission of two or more related felonies, a material element of which is
19 fraud or embezzlement, which involve a pattern of related felony conduct,
20 involving the taking of more than one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000)
21 (Section 186.11(a)(3)).

22 (3) Conviction of any specified felony sex offense that is committed after fleeing
23 to this state under specified circumstances (Section 289.5(d)).

24 (4) Prior conviction of any specified insurance fraud offense with current
25 conviction of willfully injuring, destroying, secreting, abandoning, or disposing of
26 any property insured against loss or damage by theft, embezzlement, or any
27 casualty with the intent to defraud or prejudice the insurer (Section 548(b)).

26 of, at the direction of, or in association with any criminal street gang, with the
27 specific intent to promote, further, or assist in any criminal conduct by gang
28 members (Section 186.22(b)(1)).

29 (2) Acting in concert with another person or aiding or abetting another person in
30 committing or attempting to commit a felony hate crime (Section 422.75(c)).

31 (3) Carrying a loaded or unloaded firearm together with a detachable shotgun
32 magazine, a detachable pistol magazine, a detachable magazine, or a belt- feeding
33 device during the commission or attempted commission of any felony street gang
34 crime (Section 17536(b)).

35 **Comment.** Section 17523.040 continues former Section 666.7(e) without substantive change,
36 except that paragraph (1) has been revised to reflect the increase in the term of enhancement
37 under Section 186.22(b)(1), and the downgrading of the penalty in Section 186.22(b)(2), from an
38 enhancement to a circumstance in aggravation.

1 **Penal Code § 17523.045. Schedule 2-3-5**

2 17523.045. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
3 enhancement of two, three, or five years of imprisonment in the state prison may
4 be referenced as “Schedule 2-3-5.”

5 (1) Commission of two or more related felonies, a material element of which is
6 fraud or embezzlement, which involve a pattern of related felony conduct,
7 involving the taking of more than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
8 (Section 186.11(a)(2)).

9 **Comment.** Section 17523.045 continues former Section 666.7(f) without substantive change.

10 **Penal Code § 17523.050. Schedule 3**

11 17523.050. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
12 enhancement of three years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced
13 as “Schedule 3.”

14 (1) Money laundering when the value of transactions exceeds one million dollars
15 (\$1,000,000), but is less than two million five hundred thousand dollars
16 (\$2,500,000) (Section 186.10(c)(1)(C)).

17 (2) Solicitation, recruitment, inducement, or coercion of minor to participate in
18 criminal street gang (Section 186.22(d)).

19 (3) Willfully mingling any poison or harmful substance which may cause death
20 if ingested, or which causes the infliction of great bodily injury on any person,
21 with any food, drink, medicine, or pharmaceutical product or willfully placing
22 such poison or harmful substance in any spring, well, reservoir, or public water

23 **Comment.** Section 17523.055 continues former Section 666.7(h) without substantive change.
24 See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

25 **Penal Code § 17523.060. Schedule 3-4-10**

26 17523.060. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
27 enhancement of three, four, or 10 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be
28 referenced as “Schedule 3-4-10.”

29 (1) Commission or attempted commission of any felony while armed with a
30 firearm and in the immediate possession of ammunition for the firearm designed
31 primarily to penetrate metal or armor (Section 17532).

32 (2) Commission or attempted commission of any specified sex offense while
33 using a firearm or deadly weapon (Section 17550).

34 (3) Commission or attempted commission of a felony while personally using a
35 firearm (Section 17546(a)).

36 (4) Commission or attempted commission of any specified drug offense while
37 personally using a firearm (Section 17548).

38 **Comment.** Section 17523.060 continues former Section 666.7(i) without substantive change.

1 **Penal Code § 17523.065. Schedule 4**

2 17523.065. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
3 enhancement of four years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced
4 as “Schedule 4.”

5 (1) Money laundering when the value of transactions exceeds two million five
6 hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) (Section 186.10(c)(1)(D)).

7 (2) Prior conviction of willfully inflicting upon a child any cruel or inhuman
8 corporal punishment or injury resulting in a traumatic condition with current
9 conviction of that offense (Section 273d(b)).

10 (3) Taking, damaging, or destroying any property in the commission or
11 attempted commission of a felony with the intent to cause that taking, damage, or
12 destruction when the loss exceeds two million five hundred thousand dollars
13 (\$2,500,000) (Section 12022.6(a)(4)).

14 (4) Personally, willfully, and maliciously discharging a firearm from a motor
15 vehicle at another person other than an occupant of a motor vehicle and causing a
16 victim to suffer paralysis or paraparesis of a major body part (Section 17553(a)).

17 (5) Personally, willfully, and maliciously discharging a firearm from a motor
18 vehicle at another occupied motor vehicle and causing a victim to suffer paralysis
19 or paraparesis of a major body part (Section 17553(b)).

20 (6) Willfully causing or permitting any child to suffer, or inflicting on the child
21 unjustifiable physical pain or injury that results in death under circumstances or
22 conditions likely to produce great bodily harm or death, or, having the care or
23 custody of any child, willfully causing or permitting that child to be injured or
24 harmed under circumstances likely to produce great bodily harm or death, when
25 that injury or harm results in death (Section 17572).

26 (7) Fraudulently appropriating food stamps, electronically transferred benefits,
27 or authorizations to participate in the federal Food Stamp Program entrusted to a
28 public employee, or knowingly using, transferring, selling, purchasing, or
29 possessing, any of the same in an unauthorized manner, when the offense is
30 committed by means of an electronic transfer of benefits in an amount exceeding
31 two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) (Welfare and Institutions
32 Code Section 10980(h)(1)(D)).

33 (8) Execution of a scheme or artifice to defraud the Medi-Cal program or any
34 other health care program administered by the State Department of Health
35 Services or its agents or contracts, or to obtain under false or fraudulent pretenses,
36 representations, or promises any property owned by or under the custody of the
37 Medi-Cal program or any health care program administered by the department, its
38 agents, or contractors under circumstances likely to cause or that do cause two or
39 more persons great bodily injury. (Section 17588).

40 **Comment.** Section 17523.065 continues former Section 666.7(j) without substantive change,
41 except that paragraph (8) is added to reference a previously excluded enhancement.

1 **Penal Code § 17523.070. Schedule 4-5-6**

2 17523.070. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
3 enhancement of four, five, or six years of imprisonment in the state prison may be
4 referenced as “Schedule 4-5-6.”

5 (1) Infliction of great bodily injury on a child under five years old in the
6 commission or attempted commission of a felony (Section 17571).

7 **Comment.** Section 17523.070 is new. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

8 **Penal Code § 17523.075. Schedule 4-5-10**

9 17523.075. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
10 enhancement of four, five, or 10 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be
11 referenced as “Schedule 4-5-10.”

12 (1) Commission or attempted commission of a felony while personally using a
13 firearm with prior conviction of carjacking or attempted carjacking (Section
14 17546(b)).

15 **Comment.** Section 17523.075 continues former Section 666.7(k) without substantive change.

16 **Penal Code § 17523.080. Schedule 5**

17 17523.080. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
18 enhancement of five years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced
19 as “Schedule 5.”

20 (1) Using sex offender registration information to commit a felony (Sections
21 290(q)(1) and 290.4(b)(1)).

22 (2) Causing great bodily injury by willfully causing or permitting any elder or
23 dependent adult to suffer, or inflicting pain or mental suffering upon, or
24 endangering the health of, an elder or dependent adult when the victim is 70 years
25 of age or older (Section 17568(a)(2)).

26 (3) Causing death by willfully causing or permitting any elder or dependent adult
27 to suffer, or inflicting pain or mental suffering upon, or endangering the health of,
28 an elder or dependent adult when the victim is under 70 years of age (Section
29 17568(b)(1)).

30 (4) Two prior felony convictions of knowingly causing or participating in a
31 vehicular collision or accident for the purpose of presenting any false or fraudulent
32 claim with current conviction of the same (Section 550(f)).

33 (5) Prior conviction of a serious felony with current conviction of a serious
34 felony (Section 667(a)(1)).

35 (6) Prior conviction of any specified sex offense with current conviction of lewd
36 and lascivious acts with a child under 14 years of age (Section 667.51(a)).

37 (7) Prior conviction of any specified sex offense with current conviction of any
38 of those sex offenses (Section 667.6(a)).

1 (8) Kidnapping or carrying away any child under 14 years of age with the intent
2 to permanently deprive the parent or legal guardian custody of that child (Section
3 667.85).

4 (9) Personally inflicting great bodily injury on any person other than an
5 accomplice in the commission or attempted commission of a felony that causes the
6 victim to become comatose due to a brain injury or to suffer paralysis of a
7 permanent nature (Section 17566).

8 (10) Personally inflicting great bodily injury on another person who is 70 years
9 of age or older other than an accomplice in the commission or attempted
10 commission of a felony (Section 17567).

11 (11) Inflicting great bodily injury on any victim in the commission or attempted
12 commission of any specified sex offense (Section 17578).

13 (12) Personally and intentionally inflicting injury upon a pregnant woman during
14 the commission or attempted commission of a felony that results in the termination
15 of the pregnancy when the defendant knew or reasonably should have known that
16 the victim was pregnant (Section 17569).

17 (13) Using information disclosed to the licensee of a community care facility by
18 a prospective client regarding his or her status as a sex offender to commit a felony
19 (Health and Safety Code Section 1522.01(c)).

20 (14) Commission of any specified drug offense involving a substance containing
21 heroin, cocaine base, cocaine, methamphetamine, amphetamine, or phencyclidine
22 (PCP), when the substance exceeds 4 kilograms or 100 liters (Health and Safety
23 Code Section 11370.4(a)(2) and (b)(2)).

24 (15) Manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, deriving, processing,
25 or preparing methamphetamine or phencyclidine (PCP), or attempting to commit
26 any of those acts, or possessing specified combinations of substances with the
27 intent to manufacture either methamphetamine or phencyclidine (PCP), when the
28 commission of the crime causes any child under 16 years of age to suffer great
29 bodily injury (Section 17574).

30 (16) Manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, deriving, processing,
31 or preparing any substance containing amphetamine, methamphetamine, or
32 phencyclidine (PCP) or its analogs or precursors, or attempting to commit any of
33 those acts, when the substance exceeds 10 gallons or three pounds (Section
34 11379.8(a)(2)).

35 (17) Fleeing the scene of the crime after commission of vehicular manslaughter
36 (Vehicle Code Section 20001(c)).

37 (18) Commission of a serious felony for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in
38 association with any criminal street gang, with the specific intent to promote,
39 further, or assist in any criminal conduct by gang members (Section 186.22(b)(1)).

40 **Comment.** Section 17523.080 continues former Section 666.7(l) without substantive change,
41 except that paragraph (18) has been added to refer to a new enhancement. See Section 17505
42 (“great bodily injury” defined).

1 **Penal Code § 17523.085. Schedule 5-6-10**

2 17523.085. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
3 enhancement of five, six, or 10 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be
4 referenced as “Schedule 5-6-10.”

5 (1) Discharging a firearm at an occupied motor vehicle in the commission or
6 attempted commission of a felony which caused great bodily injury or death to
7 another person (Section 17551).

8 (2) Commission or attempted commission of a felony while personally using an
9 assault weapon or a machinegun (Section 17547).

10 (3) Discharging a firearm from a motor vehicle in the commission or attempted
11 commission of a felony with the intent to inflict great bodily injury or death and
12 causing great bodily injury or death (Section 17552).

13 **Comment.** Section 17523.085 continues former Section 666.7(m) without substantive change.
14 See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

15 **Penal Code § 17523.090. Schedule 7**

16 17523.090. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
17 enhancement of seven years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced
18 as “Schedule 7.”

19 (1) Causing death by willfully causing or permitting any elder or dependent adult
20 to suffer, or inflicting pain or mental suffering upon, or endangering the health of,
21 an elder or dependent adult when the victim is 70 years of age or older (Section
22 17568(b)(2)).

23 **Comment.** Section 17523.090 continues former Section 666.7(n) without substantive change.

24 **Penal Code § 17523.095. Schedule 9**

25 17523.095. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
26 enhancement of nine years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced
27 as “Schedule 9.”

28 (1) Kidnapping victim for purpose of committing any specified felony sex
29 offense (Section 667.8(a)).

30 **Comment.** Section 17523.095 continues former Section 666.7(o) without substantive change.

31 **Penal Code § 17523.100. Schedule 10**

32 17523.100. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
33 enhancement of 10 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced as
34 “Schedule 10.”

35 (1) Two or more prior prison terms for any specified sex offense with current
36 conviction of any of those sex offenses (Section 667.6(b)).

37 (2) Commission or attempted commission of any specified felony offense while
38 personally using a firearm (Section 17549(b)).

1 (3) Commission of any specified drug offense involving a substance containing
2 heroin, cocaine base, cocaine, methamphetamine, amphetamine, or phencyclidine
3 (PCP), when the substance exceeds 10 kilograms or 200 liters (Health and Safety
4 Code Section 11370.4(a)(3) and (b)(3)).

5 (4) Manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, deriving, processing,
6 or preparing any substance containing amphetamine, methamphetamine, or
7 phencyclidine (PCP) or its analogs or precursors, or attempting to commit any of
8 those acts, when the substance exceeds 25 gallons or 10 pounds (Health and Safety
9 Code Section 11379.8(a)(3)).

10 (5) Commission of a violent felony for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in
11 association with any criminal street gang, with the specific intent to promote,
12 further, or assist in any criminal conduct by gang members (Section 186.22(b)(1)).

13 **Comment.** Section 17523.100 continues former Section 666.7(p) without substantive change,,
14 except that paragraph (5) has been added to refer to a new enhancement.

15 **Penal Code § 17523.105. Schedule 15**

16 17523.105. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
17 enhancement of 15 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced as
18 “Schedule 15.”

19 (1) Kidnapping victim under 14 years of age for purpose of committing any
20 specified felony sex offense (Section 667.8(b)).

21 (2) Commission of any specified drug offense involving a substance containing
22 heroin, cocaine base, cocaine, methamphetamine, amphetamine, or phencyclidine
23 (PCP), when the substance exceeds 20 kilograms or 400 liters (Health and Safety
24 Code Section 11370.4(a)(4) and (b)(4)).

25 (3) Manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, deriving, processing,
26 or preparing any substance containing amphetamine, methamphetamine, or
27 phencyclidine (PCP) or its analogs or precursors, or attempting to commit any of
28 those acts, when the substance exceeds 105 gallons or 44 pounds (Health and
29 Safety Code Section 11379.8(a)(4)).

30 **Comment.** Section 17523.105 continues former Section 666.7(q) without substantive change.

31 **Penal Code § 17523.110. Schedule 20**

32 17523.110. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
33 enhancement of 20 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced as
34 “Schedule 20.”

35 (1) Intentionally and personally discharging a firearm in the commission or
36 attempted commission of any specified felony offense (Section 17549(c)).

37 (2) Commission of any specified drug offense involving a substance containing
38 heroin, cocaine base, or cocaine, when the substance exceeds 40 kilograms (Health
39 and Safety Code Section 11370.4(a)(5)).

40 **Comment.** Section 17523.110 continues former Section 666.7(r) without substantive change.

1 **Penal Code § 17523.115. Schedule 25**

2 17523.115. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
3 enhancement of 25 years of imprisonment in the state prison may be referenced as
4 “Schedule 25.”

5 (1) Commission of any specified drug offense involving a substance containing
6 heroin, cocaine base, or cocaine, when the substance exceeds 80 kilograms (Health
7 and Safety Code Section 11370.4(a)(6)).

8 **Comment.** Section 17523.115 continues former Section 666.7(s) without substantive change.

9 **Penal Code § 17523.120. Schedule 25-Life**

10 17523.120. The provisions listed in this section imposing a sentence
11 enhancement of 25 years to life imprisonment in the state prison may be
12 referenced as “Schedule 25-Life.”

13 (1) Intentionally and personally discharging a firearm in the commission or
14 attempted commission of any specified felony offense and proximately causing
15 great bodily injury to any person other than an accomplice (Section 17549(d)).

16 **Comment.** Section 17523.120 continues former Section 666.7(t) without substantive change.
17 See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

18 **CHAPTER 2. WEAPON ENHANCEMENTS**

19 **Article 1. General Provisions**

20 **Penal Code § 17525. Limit on multiple enhancements**

21 17525. When two or more enhancements may be imposed for being armed with
22 or using a dangerous or deadly weapon or a firearm in the commission of a single
23 offense, only the greatest of those enhancements shall be imposed for that offense.
24 This section does not limit the imposition of any other enhancements applicable to
25 that offense, including an enhancement for the infliction of great bodily injury.

26 **Comment.** Section 17525 continues former Section 1170.1(f) without substantive change. See
27 Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

28 **Penal Code § 17526. Firearm deemed nuisance**

29 17526. When a person is found to have used a deadly or dangerous weapon in
30 the commission or attempted commission of a felony, resulting in an enhancement
31 pursuant to this title, and the weapon is owned by that person, the court shall order
32 that the weapon be deemed a nuisance and disposed of in the manner provided in
33 Section 12028.

34 **Comment.** Section 17526 generalizes former Sections 12022(b)(3), 12022.5(e), and
35 12022.53(k). The generalized rule is consistent with other sections providing for confiscation of a
36 weapon used in a crime. See Sections 188.22a(f), 245e(d), 245.3, 417.6, 833.5(e), 12028,
37 12028.5(e), 12036(c).

1 ☞ **Note.** The nuisance provision found in Sections 12022(b)(3), 12022.5(e), and 12022.53(k) has
2 been generalized. The nuisance rule would then apply to weapon enhancements under Sections
3 12022.3(a) (use of firearm or deadly weapon in sex offense), 12022.55 (discharge of weapon
4 from motor vehicle causing great bodily injury or death), and 12022.9 (willful and malicious
5 discharge of weapon resulting in paralysis or paraparesis). The Commission would like to receive
6 input on the merit of making this change.

7 Article 2. Enhancement for Possession or Provision of Weapon

8 **Penal Code § 17530. Armed with firearm in commission of felony**

9 17530. Any person who is armed with a firearm in the commission or attempted
10 commission of a felony shall, upon conviction of that felony or attempted felony,
11 in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for the felony or
12 attempted felony of which he or she has been convicted, be punished by an
13 additional term of one year, unless the arming is an element of the offense of
14 which he or she was convicted. This additional term applies to any person who is a
15 principal in the commission or attempted commission of a felony if one or more of
16 the principals is armed with a firearm, whether or not the person is personally
17 armed with a firearm.

18 **Comment.** Section 17530 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
19 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section
20 12022(a)(1) without substantive change.

21 **Penal Code § 17531. Armed with assault weapon or machine gun in commission of felony**

22 17531. Any person who is armed with an assault weapon, as defined in Section
23 12276 or Section 12276.1, or a machinegun, as defined in Section 12200, in the
24 commission or attempted commission of a felony shall, upon conviction of that
25 felony or attempted felony, in addition and consecutive to the punishment
26 prescribed for the felony or attempted felony of which he or she has been
27 convicted, be punished by an additional term of three years, whether or not the
28 arming is an element of the offense of which he or she was convicted. The
29 additional term provided in this paragraph applies to any person who is a principal
30 in the commission or attempted commission of a felony if one or more of the
31 principals is armed with an assault weapon or machinegun whether or not the
32 person is personally armed with an assault weapon or machinegun.

33 **Comment.** Section 17531 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
34 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section restates former Section 12022(a)(2)
35 without substantive change. The first sentence incorporates part of former Section 12022(a)(1)
36 that is implicitly incorporated in former Section 12022(a)(2).

37 ☞ **Note.** The first sentence has been restated to incorporate substantive elements from Section
38 12022(a)(1), which are implicitly incorporated in Section 12022(a)(2). The Commission believes
39 that this is a nonsubstantive change, but would like to receive comments on this point.

1 **Penal Code § 17532. Possession of armor-piercing ammunition in commission of felony**

2 17532. Any person who, while armed with a firearm in the commission or
3 attempted commission of any felony, has in his or her immediate possession
4 ammunition for the firearm designed primarily to penetrate metal or armor, shall
5 upon conviction of that felony or attempted felony, in addition and consecutive to
6 the punishment prescribed for the felony or attempted felony, be punished by an
7 additional term of three, four, or 10 years.

8 **Comment.** Section 17532 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
9 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues the first sentence of
10 former Section 12022.2(a) without change.

11 **Penal Code § 17533. Body vest worn in commission of felony**

12 17533. (a) Any person who wears a body vest in the commission or attempted
13 commission of a violent offense, as defined in subdivision (b) of Section 12021.1,
14 shall, upon conviction of that felony or attempted felony, in addition and
15 consecutive to the punishment prescribed for the felony or attempted felony of
16 which he or she has been convicted, be punished by an additional term of one, two,
17 or five years.

18 (b) As used in this section, “body vest” means any bullet-resistant material
19 intended to provide ballistic and trauma protection for the wearer.

20 **Comment.** Section 17533 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
21 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. Subdivision (a) continues the first sentence of
22 former Section 12022.2(b) without change. Subdivision (b) continues former Section 12022.2(c)
23 without change.

24 **Penal Code § 17534. Furnishing firearm in furtherance of felony**

25 17534. Any person who, during the commission or attempted commission of a
26 felony, furnishes or offers to furnish a firearm to another for the purpose of aiding,
27 abetting, or enabling that person or any other person to commit a felony shall, in
28 addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed by the felony or attempted
29 felony of which the person has been convicted, be punished by an additional term
30 of one, two, or three years in the state prison.

31 **Comment.** Section 17534 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
32 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues the first sentence of
33 former Section 12022.4 without change.

34 **Penal Code § 17535. Unlawful provision of weapon used in commission of felony**

35 17535. If both of the following circumstances apply, an additional term of
36 imprisonment in the state prison for one, two, or three years shall be imposed in
37 addition and consecutive to the sentence prescribed.

38 (a) A violation of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) or subdivision (b) of Section
39 12072.

1 (b) The firearm transferred in violation of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) or
2 subdivision (b) of Section 12072 is used in the subsequent commission of a felony
3 for which a conviction is obtained and the prescribed sentence is imposed.

4 **Comment.** Section 17535 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
5 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section
6 12072(g)(4) without substantive change.

7 **Penal Code § 17536. Carrying firearm in commission of street gang crime**

8 17536. (a) Every person who carries a loaded or unloaded firearm on his or her
9 person, or in a vehicle, during the commission or attempted commission of any
10 street gang crimes described in subdivision (a) or (b) of Section 186.22, shall,
11 upon conviction of the felony or attempted felony, be punished by an additional
12 term of imprisonment in the state prison for one, two, or three years in the court's
13 discretion.

14 (b) Every person who carries a loaded or unloaded firearm together with a
15 detachable shotgun magazine, a detachable pistol magazine, a detachable
16 magazine, or a belt-feeding device on his or her person, or in a vehicle, during the
17 commission or attempted commission of any street gang crimes described in
18 subdivision (a) or (b) of Section 186.22, shall, upon conviction of the felony or
19 attempted felony, be punished by an additional term of imprisonment in the state
20 prison for two, three, or four years in the court's discretion.

21 (c) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:

22 (1) "Detachable magazine" means a device that is designed or redesigned to do
23 all of the following:

24 (A) To be attached to a rifle that is designed or redesigned to fire ammunition.

25 (B) To be attached to, and detached from, a rifle that is designed or redesigned to
26 fire ammunition.

27 (C) To feed ammunition continuously and directly into the loading mechanism
28 of a rifle that is designed or redesigned to fire ammunition.

29 (2) "Detachable pistol magazine" means a device that is designed or redesigned
30 to do all of the following:

31 (A) To be attached to a semiautomatic firearm that is not a rifle or shotgun that is
32 designed or redesigned to fire ammunition.

33 (B) To be attached to, and detached from, a firearm that is not a rifle or shotgun
34 that is designed or redesigned to fire ammunition.

35 (C) To feed ammunition continuously and directly into the loading mechanism
36 of a firearm that is not a rifle or a shotgun that is designed or redesigned to fire
37 ammunition.

38 (3) "Detachable shotgun magazine" means a device that is designed or
39 redesigned to do all of the following:

40 (A) To be attached to a firearm that is designed or redesigned to fire a fixed
41 shotgun shell through a smooth or rifled bore.

1 (B) To be attached to, and detached from, a firearm that is designed or
2 redesigned to fire a fixed shotgun shell through a smooth bore.

3 (C) To feed fixed shotgun shells continuously and directly into the loading
4 mechanism of a firearm that is designed or redesigned to fire a fixed shotgun shell.

5 (4) “Belt-feeding device” means a device that is designed or redesigned to
6 continuously feed ammunition into the loading mechanism of a machinegun or a
7 semiautomatic firearm.

8 (5) “Rifle” has the same meaning as specified in paragraph (20) of subdivision
9 (c) of Section 12020.

10 (6) “Shotgun” has the same meaning as specified in paragraph (21) of
11 subdivision (c) of Section 12020.

12 **Comment.** Section 17536 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
13 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section 12021.5
14 without change, except that the second and third sentences of subdivisions (a) and (b) are not
15 continued in this section. They are generalized without substantive change in Section 17520.

16 **Penal Code § 17537. Armed with firearm in commission of drug offenses**

17 17537. (a) Any person who is personally armed with a firearm in the
18 commission or attempted commission of a violation of Section 11351, 11351.5,
19 11352, 11366.5, 11366.6, 11378, 11378.5, 11379, 11379.5, or 11379.6 of the
20 Health and Safety Code, shall, upon conviction of that offense and in addition and
21 consecutive to the punishment prescribed for that offense of which he or she has
22 been convicted, be punished by an additional term of imprisonment in the state
23 prison for three, four, or five years in the court’s discretion.

24 (b) Any person who is not personally armed with a firearm who, knowing that
25 another principal is personally armed with a firearm, is a principal in the
26 commission or attempted commission of an offense specified in subdivision (a),
27 shall, upon conviction of that offense, be punished by an additional term of one,
28 two, or three years in the court’s discretion.

29 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the court may strike the
30 additional punishment for the enhancements provided in subdivision (a) or (b) in
31 an unusual case where the interests of justice would best be served, if the court
32 specifies on the record and enters into the minutes the circumstances indicating
33 that the interests of justice would best be served by that disposition.

34 **Comment.** Section 17537 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
35 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section 12022(c)-
36 (d), (f) without change, except that the second and third sentences of subdivisions (c) and (d) are
37 not continued in this section. They are generalized without substantive change in Section 17520.

38 **Penal Code § 17538. Armed with firearm or deadly weapon in commission of sexual offenses**

39 17538. For each violation or attempted violation of Section 261, 262, 264.1, 286,
40 288, 288a, or 289, and in addition to the sentence provided, any person shall

1 receive a one-, two-, or five-year enhancement if the person is armed with a
2 firearm or a deadly weapon.

3 **Comment.** Section 17538 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
4 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section restates the first sentence of former
5 Section 12022.3(b) without change.

6 **Penal Code § 17539. Unlawful provision of assault weapon to minor**

7 17539. In addition and consecutive to the punishment imposed under subdivision
8 (a) of Section 12280, any person who transfers, lends, sells, or gives any assault
9 weapon to a minor in violation of subdivision (a) of Section 12280 shall receive an
10 enhancement of one year.

11 **Comment.** Section 17539 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
12 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section
13 12280(a)(2) without substantive change.

14 Article 3. Enhancement for Use of Weapon

15 **Penal Code § 17545. Use of deadly or dangerous weapon in commission of felony**

16 17545. (a) Any person who personally uses a deadly or dangerous weapon in the
17 commission or attempted commission of a felony shall, upon conviction of that
18 felony or attempted felony, in addition and consecutive to the punishment
19 prescribed for the felony or attempted felony of which he or she has been
20 convicted, be punished by an additional term of one year, unless use of a deadly or
21 dangerous weapon is an element of the offense of which he or she was convicted.

22 (b) If the person described in subdivision (a) has been convicted of carjacking or
23 attempted carjacking, the additional term shall be one, two, or three years.

24 **Comment.** Section 17545 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
25 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section
26 12022(b)(1)-(2) without substantive change. Former subdivisions (b)(1) and (2) have been
27 redesignated as subdivisions (a) and (b), respectively.

28 **Penal Code § 17546. Personal use of firearm in commission of felony**

29 17546. (a) Any person who personally uses a firearm in the commission or
30 attempted commission of a felony shall, upon conviction of that felony or
31 attempted felony, in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for the
32 felony or attempted felony of which he or she has been convicted, be punished by
33 an additional term of imprisonment in the state prison for three, four, or 10 years,
34 unless use of a firearm is an element of the offense of which he or she was
35 convicted.

36 (b) If the person described in subdivision (a) has been convicted of carjacking or
37 attempted carjacking, the additional term shall be four, five, or 10 years.

38 (c) The additional term provided by this section may be imposed in cases of
39 assault with a firearm under paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 245, or

1 assault with a deadly weapon which is a firearm under Section 245, or murder if
2 the killing was perpetrated by means of shooting a firearm from a motor vehicle,
3 intentionally at another person outside of the vehicle with the intent to inflict great
4 bodily injury or death.

5 **Comment.** Section 17546 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
6 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. Subdivision (a) continues former Section
7 12022.5(a)(1) without change. Subdivision (b) continues the first sentence of former Section
8 12022.5(a)(2) without change. Subdivision (c) continues former Section 12022.5(d) without
9 change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

10 **Penal Code § 17547. Personal use of assault weapon or machine gun in commission of felony**

11 17547. (a) Any person who personally uses an assault weapon, as specified in
12 Section 12276 or Section 12276.1, or a machinegun, as defined in Section 12200,
13 in the commission or attempted commission of a felony, shall, upon conviction of
14 that felony or attempted felony, in addition and consecutive to the sentence
15 prescribed for the felony or attempted felony, be punished by an additional term of
16 imprisonment in the state prison for five, six, or 10 years.

17 (b) The additional term provided by this section may be imposed in cases of
18 assault with a firearm under paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 245, or
19 assault with a deadly weapon which is a firearm under Section 245, or murder if
20 the killing was perpetrated by means of shooting a firearm from a motor vehicle,
21 intentionally at another person outside of the vehicle with the intent to inflict great
22 bodily injury or death.

23 **Comment.** Section 17547 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
24 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. Subdivision (a) continues former Section
25 12022.5(b)(2) without change. Subdivision (b) continues former Section 12022.5(d) without
26 change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

27 **Penal Code § 17548. Personal use of firearm in commission of drug offenses**

28 17548. (a) Any person who personally uses a firearm in the commission or
29 attempted commission of a violation of Section 11351, 11351.5, 11352, 11366.5,
30 11366.6, 11378, 11378.5, 11379, 11379.5, or 11379.6 of the Health and Safety
31 Code, shall, upon conviction of that offense and in addition and consecutive to the
32 punishment prescribed for the offense of which he or she has been convicted, be
33 punished by an additional term of imprisonment in the state prison for three, four,
34 or 10 years in the court’s discretion.

35 (b) The additional term provided by this section may be imposed in cases of
36 assault with a firearm under paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 245, or
37 assault with a deadly weapon which is a firearm under Section 245, or murder if
38 the killing was perpetrated by means of shooting a firearm from a motor vehicle,
39 intentionally at another person outside of the vehicle with the intent to inflict great
40 bodily injury or death.

41 **Comment.** Section 17548 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
42 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. Subdivision (a) continues the first sentence of

1 former Section 12022.5(c) without substantive change. Subdivision (b) continues former Section
2 12022.5(d) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

3 **Penal Code § 17549. Use of weapon in commission of specified violent offenses**

4 17549. (a) This section applies to the following felonies:

5 (1) Section 187 (murder).

6 (2) Section 203 or 205 (mayhem).

7 (3) Section 207, 209, or 209.5 (kidnapping).

8 (4) Section 211 (robbery).

9 (5) Section 215 (carjacking).

10 (6) Section 220 (assault with intent to commit a specified felony).

11 (7) Subdivision (d) of Section 245 (assault with a firearm on a peace officer or
12 firefighter).

13 (8) Section 261 or 262 (rape).

14 (9) Section 264.1 (rape or sexual penetration in concert).

15 (10) Section 286 (sodomy).

16 (11) Section 288 or 288.5 (lewd act on a child).

17 (12) Section 288a (oral copulation).

18 (13) Section 289 (sexual penetration).

19 (14) Section 4500 (assault by life prisoner).

20 (15) Section 4501 (assault by prisoner).

21 (16) Section 4503 (holding a hostage by prisoner).

22 (17) Any felony punishable by death or imprisonment in the state prison for life.

23 (18) Any attempt to commit a crime listed in this subdivision other than an
24 assault.

25 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who is convicted of
26 a felony specified in subdivision (a), and who in the commission of that felony
27 personally used a firearm, shall be punished by a term of imprisonment of 10 years
28 in the state prison, which shall be imposed in addition and consecutive to the
29 punishment prescribed for that felony. The firearm need not be operable or loaded
30 for this enhancement to apply.

31 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who is convicted of a
32 felony specified in subdivision (a), and who in the commission of that felony
33 intentionally and personally discharged a firearm, shall be punished by a term of
34 imprisonment of 20 years in the state prison, which shall be imposed in addition
35 and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for that felony.

36 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who is convicted of
37 a felony specified in subdivision (a), Section 246, or subdivision (c) or (d) of
38 Section 12034, and who in the commission of that felony intentionally and
39 personally discharged a firearm and proximately caused great bodily injury or
40 death to any person other than an accomplice, shall be punished by a term of
41 imprisonment of 25 years to life in the state prison, which shall be imposed in
42 addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for that felony.

1 (e)(1) The enhancements specified in this section apply to any person charged as
2 a principal in the commission of an offense that includes an allegation pursuant to
3 this section when a violation of both this section and subdivision (b) of Section
4 186.22 are pled and proved.

5 (2) An enhancement for participation in a criminal street gang pursuant to
6 Chapter 11 (commencing with Section 186.20) of Title 7 of Part 1, shall not be
7 imposed on a person in addition to an enhancement imposed pursuant to this
8 subdivision, unless the person personally used or personally discharged a firearm
9 in the commission of the offense.

10 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, probation shall not be granted to,
11 nor shall the execution or imposition of sentence be suspended for, any person
12 found to come within the provisions of this section.

13 (g) Notwithstanding Section 1385 or any other provision of law, the court shall
14 not strike an allegation under this section or a finding bringing a person within the
15 provisions of this section.

16 (h) The total amount of credits awarded pursuant to Article 2.5 (commencing
17 with Section 2930) of Chapter 7 of Title 1 of Part 3 or pursuant to Section 4019 or
18 any other provision of law shall not exceed 15 percent of the total term of
19 imprisonment imposed on a defendant upon whom a sentence is imposed pursuant
20 to this section.

21 (i) The enhancements specified in this section do not apply to the lawful use or
22 discharge of a firearm by a public officer, as provided in Section 196, or by any
23 person in lawful self-defense, lawful defense of another, or lawful defense of
24 property, as provided in Sections 197, 198, and 198.5.

25 **Comment.** Section 17549 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
26 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. Subdivisions (a)-(e) continue former Section
27 12022.53(a)-(e) without substantive change. Subdivisions (f)-(i) continue former Section
28 12022.53(g)-(i) without change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

29 **Penal Code § 17550. Use of firearm or deadly weapon in commission of sexual offenses**

30 17550. For each violation or attempted violation of Section 261, 262, 264.1, 286,
31 288, 288a, or 289, and in addition to the sentence provided, any person shall
32 receive a three-, four-, or 10-year enhancement if the person uses a firearm or a
33 deadly weapon in the commission of the violation.

34 **Comment.** Section 17550 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
35 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section restates former Section 12022.3(a)
36 without substantive change.

37 **Penal Code § 17551. Discharge of firearm at an occupied vehicle, resulting in great bodily**
38 **injury or death**

39 17551. (a) Any person who is convicted of a felony or an attempt to commit a
40 felony, including murder or attempted murder, in which that person discharged a
41 firearm at an occupied motor vehicle which caused great bodily injury or death to

1 the person of another, shall, upon conviction of that felony or attempted felony, in
2 addition and consecutive to the sentence prescribed for the felony or attempted
3 felony, be punished by an additional term of imprisonment in the state prison for
4 five, six, or 10 years.

5 (b) The additional term provided by this section may be imposed in cases of
6 assault with a firearm under paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 245, or
7 assault with a deadly weapon which is a firearm under Section 245, or murder if
8 the killing was perpetrated by means of shooting a firearm from a motor vehicle,
9 intentionally at another person outside of the vehicle with the intent to inflict great
10 bodily injury or death.

11 **Comment.** Section 17551 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
12 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section
13 12022.5(b)(1) and (d) without change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

14 **Penal Code § 17552. Discharge of firearm from vehicle resulting in great bodily injury or**
15 **death**

16 17552. Any person who, with the intent to inflict great bodily injury or death,
17 inflicts great bodily injury or causes the death of a person, other than an occupant
18 of a motor vehicle, as a result of discharging a firearm from a motor vehicle in the
19 commission of a felony or attempted felony, shall, upon conviction of the felony
20 or attempted felony, in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for
21 the felony or attempted felony of which he or she has been convicted, be punished
22 by an additional term of imprisonment in the state prison for five, six, or 10 years.

23 **Comment.** Section 17552 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
24 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section 12022.55
25 without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

26 **Penal Code § 17553. Discharge of firearm from vehicle that results in paralysis or**
27 **paraparesis of victim**

28 17553. (a) A person convicted of a violation of subdivision (c) of Section 12034
29 shall, in addition and consecutive to the punishment for that violation, be punished
30 by an additional term of four years, if as a result of the defendant personally and
31 willfully and maliciously discharging the firearm, the victim suffers paralysis or
32 paraparesis of a major body part, including, but not limited to, the entire hand or
33 foot.

34 (b) A person convicted of a violation of Section 246 shall, in addition and
35 consecutive to the punishment for that violation, be punished by an additional term
36 of four years, if as a result of the defendant personally and willfully and
37 maliciously discharging the firearm at an occupied motor vehicle from another
38 motor vehicle, the victim suffers paralysis or paraparesis of a major body part,
39 including, but not limited to, the entire hand or foot.

40 (c) For purposes of this subdivision:

1 (1) “Paralysis” means a major or complete loss of motor function resulting from
2 injury to the nervous system or to a muscular mechanism.

3 (2) “Paraparesis” means a significant weakness of a major body part, including,
4 but not limited to, the entire hand or foot, causing the extremity to be functionally
5 impaired and rendered useless to assist with one of the basic skills in life such as
6 eating or walking.

7 **Comment.** Section 17553 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
8 enhancements for crimes that involve a weapon. This section continues former Section
9 12022.9(b) without substantive change. Former Section 12022.9(b)(3)(C) is redundant and is not
10 continued. See Section 1170.1(e). This is a technical, nonsubstantive change.

11 CHAPTER 3. INJURY ENHANCEMENTS

12 Article 1. General Provisions

13 **Penal Code § 17560. Limit on multiple enhancements**

14 17560. When two or more enhancements may be imposed for the infliction of
15 great bodily injury in the commission of a single offense, only the greatest of those
16 enhancements shall be imposed for that offense. This section shall not limit the
17 imposition of any other enhancements applicable to that offense, including an
18 enhancement for being armed with or using a dangerous or deadly weapon or a
19 firearm.

20 **Comment.** Section 17560 continues former Section 1170.1(g) without substantive change. See
21 Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

22 Article 2. Enhancements for Injury

23 **Penal Code § 17565. Infliction of great bodily injury in commission of felony**

24 17565. (a) A person who personally inflicts great bodily injury on any person
25 other than an accomplice in the commission or attempted commission of a felony
26 shall, in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for the felony or
27 attempted felony of which he or she has been convicted, be punished by an
28 additional term of three years, unless infliction of great bodily injury is an element
29 of the offense of which he or she is convicted.

30 (b) This section does not apply to murder or manslaughter or a violation of
31 Section 451 or 452.

32 **Comment.** Section 17565 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
33 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 12022.7(a)
34 and the first sentence of former subdivision (g) without change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily
35 injury” defined).

1 **Penal Code § 17566. Infliction of great bodily injury causing coma or paralysis**

2 17566. (a) A person who personally inflicts great bodily injury on any person
3 other than an accomplice in the commission or attempted commission of a felony
4 which causes the victim to become comatose due to brain injury or to suffer
5 paralysis, as defined in Section 17553, of a permanent nature, shall be punished by
6 an additional and consecutive term of five years.

7 (b) This section does not apply to murder or manslaughter or a violation of
8 Section 451 or 452.

9 **Comment.** Section 17566 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
10 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. Subdivision (a) restates former Section 12022.7(b)
11 without substantive change. The subdivision restates part of former Section 12022.7(a) that was
12 incorporated by reference in former Section 12022.7(b). Subdivision (b) continues former Section
13 12022.7(f) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

14  **Note.** Subdivision (a) restates elements of Section 12022.7(a) that are expressly incorporated
15 in Section 12022.7(b). The Commission believes that this is a nonsubstantive change, but would
16 like to receive comments on this point.

17 **Penal Code § 17567. Infliction of great bodily injury on person 70 years of age or older**

18 17567. (a) A person who personally inflicts great bodily injury on a person who
19 is 70 years of age or older, other than an accomplice in the commission or
20 attempted commission of a felony shall, in addition and consecutive to the
21 punishment prescribed for the felony or attempted felony of which he or she has
22 been convicted, be punished by an additional term of five years, unless infliction
23 of great bodily injury is an element of the offense of which he or she is convicted.

24 (b) This section does not apply to murder or manslaughter or a violation of
25 Section 451 or 452.

26 **Comment.** Section 17567 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
27 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 12022.7(c)
28 and the first sentence of former subdivision (g) without change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily
29 injury” defined).

30 **Penal Code § 17568. Elder abuse resulting in great bodily injury or death**

31 17568. (a) If in the commission of an offense described in subdivision (b) of
32 Section 368, the victim suffers great bodily injury, the defendant shall receive an
33 additional term in the state prison as follows:

34 (1) Three years if the victim is under 70 years of age.

35 (2) Five years if the victim is 70 years of age or older.

36 (b) If in the commission of an offense described in subdivision (b) of Section
37 368, the defendant proximately causes the death of the victim, the defendant shall
38 receive an additional term in the state prison as follows:

39 (1) Five years if the victim is under 70 years of age.

40 (2) Seven years if the victim is 70 years of age or older.

41 **Comment.** Section 17568 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
42 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. Subdivisions (a) and (b) continue former

1 subdivision (b)(2)-(3) of Section 368 without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great
2 bodily injury” defined).

3 **Penal Code § 17569. Intentional infliction of injury causing termination of pregnancy**

4 17569. (a) Any person who, during the commission or attempted commission of
5 a felony, knows or reasonably should know that the victim is pregnant, and who,
6 with intent to inflict injury, and without the consent of the woman, personally
7 inflicts injury upon a pregnant woman that results in the termination of the
8 pregnancy shall, in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed by the
9 felony or attempted felony of which the person has been convicted, be punished by
10 an additional term of five years in the state prison.

11 (b) Nothing in this section shall be construed as affecting the applicability of
12 subdivision (a) of Section 187 of the Penal Code.

13 **Comment.** Section 17569 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
14 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. Subdivision (a) continues the first sentence of
15 former Section 12022.9(a) without change. Subdivision (b) continues the third sentence of former
16 Section 12022.9(a).

17 **Penal Code § 17570. Infliction of great bodily injury involving domestic violence**

18 17570. (a) A person who personally inflicts great bodily injury under
19 circumstances involving domestic violence in the commission or attempted
20 commission of a felony shall, in addition and consecutive to the punishment
21 prescribed for the felony or attempted felony of which he or she has been
22 convicted, be punished by an additional term of three, four, or five years. As used
23 in this section, “domestic violence” has the meaning provided in subdivision (b) of
24 Section 13700.

25 (b) This section does not apply to murder or manslaughter or a violation of
26 Section 451 or 452.

27 **Comment.** Section 17570 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
28 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. Subdivision (a) continues the first and fourth
29 sentences of former Section 12022.7(e) without change. Subdivision (b) continues the first
30 sentence of former Section 12022.7(g) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great
31 bodily injury” defined).

32 **Penal Code § 17571. Great bodily injury to child under five years old**

33 17572. A person who personally inflicts great bodily injury on a child under the
34 age of five years in the commission or attempted commission of a felony shall, in
35 addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for the felony or attempted
36 felony of which he or she has been convicted, be punished by an additional term of
37 four, five, or six years, unless infliction of great bodily injury is an element of the
38 offense of which he or she is convicted.

39 **Comment.** Section 17571 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
40 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues the first sentence of former
41 Section 12022.7(d) without change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

1 **Penal Code § 17572. Willful harm or injury resulting in death of child**

2 17572. Any person convicted of a violation of Section 273a, who under
3 circumstances or conditions likely to produce great bodily harm or death, willfully
4 causes or permits any child to suffer, or inflicts thereon unjustifiable physical pain
5 or injury that results in death, or having the care or custody of any child, under
6 circumstances likely to produce great bodily harm or death, willfully causes or
7 permits that child to be injured or harmed, and that injury or harm results in death,
8 shall receive a four-year enhancement for each violation, in addition to the
9 sentence provided for that conviction. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed
10 as affecting the applicability of subdivision (a) of Section 187 or Section 192.

11 **Comment.** Section 17572 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
12 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues the first two sentences of
13 former Section 12022.95 without change.

14 **Penal Code § 17573. Child abuse involving female genital mutilation**

15 17573. (a) If the act constituting a felony violation of subdivision (a) of Section
16 273a was female genital mutilation, as defined in subdivision (b), the defendant
17 shall be punished by an additional term of imprisonment in the state prison for one
18 year, in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed by Section 273a.

19 (b) “Female genital mutilation” means the excision or infibulation of the labia
20 majora, labia minora, clitoris, or vulva, performed for nonmedical purposes.

21 (c) Nothing in this section precludes prosecution under Section 203, 205, or 206
22 or any other provision of law.

23 **Comment.** Section 17573 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
24 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section restates former language from Section
25 273.4 without substantive change.

26 **Penal Code § 17574. Controlled substance manufacture resulting in great bodily injury to**
27 **child**

28 17574. Any person convicted of a violation of, or of an attempt to violate,
29 subdivision (a) of Section 11379.6 or Section 11383 of the Health and Safety
30 Code, as those sections relate to methamphetamine or phencyclidine, where the
31 commission of the crime causes any child under 16 years of age to suffer great
32 bodily injury, shall, in addition and consecutive to the punishment prescribed for
33 the felony of which he or she has been convicted, be punished by an additional
34 term of five years in the state prison.

35 **Comment.** Section 17574 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
36 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section restates former language from Health
37 and Safety Code Section 11379.7(b) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great
38 bodily injury” defined).

1 **Penal Code § 17575. Controlled substance manufacture resulting in death or great bodily**
2 **injury**

3 17575. (a) Any person convicted of a violation of, or of an attempt to violate,
4 subdivision (a) of Section 11379.6 or Section 11383 of the Health and Safety
5 Code, as those sections relate to methamphetamine or phencyclidine, when the
6 commission or attempted commission of the offense causes the death or great
7 bodily injury of another person other than an accomplice, shall, in addition and
8 consecutive to any other punishment authorized by law, be punished by an
9 additional term of one year in the state prison for each death or injury.

10 (b) Nothing in this section shall preclude prosecution under both this section and
11 Section 187, 192, 17565, 17566, 17567, or 17570, or any other provision of law.
12 However, a person who is punished under another provision of law for causing
13 death or great bodily injury as described in subdivision (a) shall not receive an
14 additional term of imprisonment under this section.

15 **Comment.** Section 17575 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
16 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Health and Safety
17 Code Section 11379.9 without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury”
18 defined).

19 ☞ **Note.** The purpose of subdivision (b) is unclear. The first sentence provides that a person may
20 be “prosecuted” under Section 17575 as well as any of the specified sections. The second
21 sentence seems to provide that a person may not receive an enhancement under this section if the
22 person is punished under any other law for causing death or great bodily injury. This is probably
23 meant as a reiteration of the general rule that a person may only receive a single enhancement (the
24 greatest) for causing great bodily injury in commission of a single offense. See Section 1170.1(g).
25 If so, it is superfluous. However, it might be read to mean that an enhancement under this section
26 does not apply even if the punishment is for another offense, or if another applicable
27 enhancement is of a lesser duration.

28 The Commission would like to receive input on the meaning of subdivision (b) and whether it
29 serves any useful purpose.

30 **Penal Code § 17576. Poisoning resulting in great bodily injury or possibility of death**

31 17576. Any violation of subdivision (a) of Section 347 involving the use of a
32 poison or harmful substance that may cause death if ingested or that causes the
33 infliction of great bodily injury on any person shall be punished by an additional
34 term of three years.

35 **Comment.** Section 17576 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
36 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 347(a)(2)
37 without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

38 **Penal Code § 17577. Forced ingestion of controlled substance**

39 17577. Any person who, for the purpose of committing a felony, administers by
40 injection, inhalation, ingestion, or any other means, any controlled substance listed
41 in Section 11054, 11055, 11056, 11057, or 11058 of the Health and Safety Code,
42 against the victim’s will by means of force, violence, or fear of immediate and

1 unlawful bodily injury to the victim or another person, shall, in addition and
2 consecutive to the penalty provided for the felony or attempted felony of which he
3 or she has been convicted, be punished by an additional term of three years.

4 **Comment.** Section 17577 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
5 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 12022.75
6 without change.

7 **Penal Code § 17578. Infliction of great bodily injury in commission of certain sexual**
8 **offenses**

9 17578. Any person who inflicts great bodily injury on any victim in a violation
10 or attempted violation of paragraph (2), (3), or (6) of subdivision (a) of Section
11 261, paragraph (1) or (4) of subdivision (a) of Section 262, Section 264.1,
12 subdivision (b) of Section 288, subdivision (a) of Section 289, or sodomy or oral
13 copulation by force, violence, duress, menace, or fear of immediate and unlawful
14 bodily injury on the victim or another person as provided in Section 286 or 288a
15 shall receive a five-year enhancement for each such violation in addition to the
16 sentence provided for the felony conviction.

17 **Comment.** Section 17578 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
18 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 12022.8
19 without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

20 **Penal Code § 17579. Commission of certain sexual offenses by person who knows he or she**
21 **has AIDS**

22 17579. (a) Any person who violates one or more of the offenses listed in
23 subdivision (b) with knowledge that he or she has acquired immune deficiency
24 syndrome (AIDS) or with the knowledge that he or she carries antibodies of the
25 human immunodeficiency virus at the time of the commission of those offenses,
26 shall receive a three-year enhancement for each violation in addition to the
27 sentence provided under those sections.

28 (b) Subdivision (a) applies to the following crimes:

29 (1) Rape in violation of Section 261.

30 (2) Unlawful intercourse with a person under 18 years of age in violation of
31 Section 261.5.

32 (3) Rape of a spouse in violation of Section 262.

33 (4) Sodomy in violation of Section 286.

34 (5) Oral copulation in violation of Section 288a.

35 (c) For purposes of proving the knowledge requirement of this section, the
36 prosecuting attorney may use test results received under subdivision (c) of Section
37 1202.1 or subdivision (g) of Section 1202.6.

38 **Comment.** Section 17579 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
39 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 12022.85
40 without change.

1 **Penal Code § 17580. Arson resulting in great bodily injury**

2 17580. Notwithstanding any other law, any person who is convicted of a felony
3 violation of Section 451 shall be punished by a three-, four-, or five-year
4 enhancement if one or more of the following circumstances is found to be true:

5 (a) A firefighter, peace officer, or other emergency personnel suffered great
6 bodily injury as a result of the offense. The additional term provided by this
7 subdivision shall be imposed whenever applicable, including any instance in
8 which there is a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 451.

9 (b) The defendant proximately caused great bodily injury to more than one
10 victim in any single violation of Section 451. The additional term provided by this
11 subdivision shall be imposed whenever applicable, including any instance in
12 which there is a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 451.

13 **Comment.** Section 17580 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
14 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 451.1(a)(2)-
15 (3) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

16 **Penal Code § 17581. Aggravated arson resulting in great bodily injury**

17 17581. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, any person who is convicted of a
18 felony violation of Section 452 shall be punished by a one-, two-, or three-year
19 enhancement for each of the following circumstances that is found to be true:

20 (a) A firefighter, peace officer, or other emergency personnel suffered great
21 bodily injury as a result of the offense. The additional term provided by this
22 subdivision shall be imposed whenever applicable, including any instance in
23 which there is a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 452.

24 (b) The defendant proximately caused great bodily injury to more than one
25 victim in any single violation of Section 452. The additional term provided by this
26 subdivision shall be imposed whenever applicable, including any instance in
27 which there is a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 452.

28 **Comment.** Section 17581 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
29 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 452.1(a)(2)-
30 (3) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

31 **Penal Code § 17582. Saw-wood spiking resulting in bodily injury**

32 17582. Any person who violates section 593a and causes bodily injury to
33 another person other than an accomplice shall, in addition and consecutive to the
34 punishment prescribed for that felony, be punished by an additional prison term of
35 three years.

36 **Comment.** Section 17582 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
37 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 593a(b)
38 without substantive change.

1 **Penal Code § 17583. Unlawful disposal, transport, or treatment of hazardous waste**
2 **resulting in great bodily injury or probability of death**

3 17583. Any person convicted of violating subdivision (b), (c), or (d) of Section
4 25189.5 of the Health and Safety Code, where the act that caused the violation
5 caused great bodily injury, or caused a substantial probability that death could
6 result, may be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for one, two, or three
7 years, in addition and consecutive to the term specified in subdivision (b), (c), or
8 (d) of Section 25189.5 of the Health and Safety Code, and may be fined up to two
9 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for each day of violation. For the
10 purposes of this section, “each day of violation” has the meaning provided in
11 subdivision (f) of Section 25189.5 of the Health and Safety Code,

12 **Comment.** Section 17583 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
13 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section restates former language from Health
14 and Safety Code Section 25189.5(e) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great
15 bodily injury” defined).

16 **Penal Code § 17584. Unlawful disposal, transport, or treatment of hazardous waste**
17 **resulting in great bodily injury or probability of death**

18 17584. Any person convicted of violating subdivision (b) of Section 25189.7 of
19 the Health and Safety Code, where the act that caused the violation caused great
20 bodily injury, or caused a substantial probability that death could result, may be
21 punished by imprisonment in the state prison for one, two, or three years, in
22 addition and consecutive to the term specified in subdivision (b) of Section
23 25189.7 of the Health and Safety Code, and may be fined up to two hundred fifty
24 thousand dollars (\$250,000) for each day of violation.

25 **Comment.** Section 17584 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
26 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section restates the former second sentence of
27 Health and Safety Code Section 25189.7(c) without substantive change. See Section 17505
28 (“great bodily injury” defined).

29 **Penal Code § 17585. Injuries caused while driving in violation of certain sections**

30 17585. (a) Any person who proximately causes bodily injury or death to more
31 than one victim in any one instance of driving in violation of Section 23153 of this
32 code or in violation of Section 191.5 of, or paragraph (3) of subdivision (c) of
33 Section 192 of, the Penal Code, shall, upon a felony conviction, and
34 notwithstanding Section 17560, receive an enhancement of one year in the state
35 prison for each additional injured victim. The maximum number of one year
36 enhancements which may be imposed pursuant to this section is three.

37 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the court may strike the
38 enhancements provided in this section if it determines that there are circumstances
39 in mitigation of the additional punishment and states on the record its reasons for
40 striking the additional punishment.

1 **Comment.** Section 17585 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
2 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former language from
3 Vehicle Code Section 23558 without substantive change.

4 **Penal Code § 17586. Staged accident resulting in serious bodily injury**

5 17586. (a) Any person who violates paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of Section
6 550 shall receive a two-year enhancement for each person other than an
7 accomplice who suffers serious bodily injury resulting from the vehicular collision
8 or accident in a violation of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a).

9 (b) This section shall not be construed to preclude the applicability of any other
10 provision of criminal law or equitable remedy that applies or may apply to any act
11 committed or alleged to have been committed by a person.

12 **Comment.** Section 17586 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
13 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 550(g)-(h)
14 without substantive change.

15 **Penal Code § 17587. Injury to police dog or horse**

16 17587. (a) Any person who, in violation of Section 600, and with intent to inflict
17 injury or death, personally causes the death, destruction, or serious physical injury
18 including bone fracture, loss or impairment of function of any bodily member,
19 wounds requiring extensive suturing, or serious crippling, of any horse or dog,
20 shall, upon conviction of a felony under Section 600, in addition and consecutive
21 to the punishment prescribed for the felony, be punished by an additional term of
22 imprisonment in the state prison for one year.

23 (b) Any person who, in violation of Section 600, and with the intent to inflict
24 such injury, personally causes great bodily injury to any person not an accomplice,
25 shall, upon conviction of a felony under Section 600, in addition and consecutive
26 to the punishment prescribed for the felony, be punished by an additional term of
27 imprisonment in the state prison for two years unless the conduct described in this
28 subdivision is an element of any other offense of which the person is convicted.

29 **Comment.** Section 17587 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
30 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues former Section 600(c)-(d)
31 without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great bodily injury” defined).

32 **Penal Code § 17588. Medi-Cal fraud resulting in injury**

33 17588. If the execution of a scheme or artifice to defraud as defined in paragraph
34 (4) of subdivision (b) of Section 14107 of the Health and Safety Code is
35 committed under circumstances likely to cause or that do cause two or more
36 persons great bodily injury, or serious bodily injury, as defined in paragraph (4) of
37 subdivision (f) of Section 243, a term of four years, in addition and consecutive to
38 the term of imprisonment imposed in subdivision (c), shall be imposed for each
39 person who suffers great bodily injury or serious bodily injury.

1 **Comment.** Section 17588 is added as part of a nonsubstantive reorganization of sentence
2 enhancements for crimes that cause an injury. This section continues the first sentence of former
3 Health and Safety Code Section 14107(d) without substantive change. See Section 17505 (“great
4 bodily injury” defined).

7 (f)(1) No person who is licensed pursuant to Chapter 44 (commencing with
8 Section 921) of Title 18 of the United States Code shall deliver, sell, or transfer a
9 firearm to a person who is licensed pursuant to Chapter 44 (commencing with
10 Section 921) of Title 18 of the United States Code and whose licensed premises
11 are located in this state unless one of the following conditions is met:

12 (A) The person presents proof of licensure pursuant to Section 12071 to that
13 person.

14 (B) The person presents proof that he or she is exempt from licensure under
15 Section 12071 to that person, in which case the person also shall present proof that

36 of subdivision (b) results in a death which constitutes a second degree murder, as
37 defined in Section 189 of the Penal Code, the offense shall be punishable, upon
38 conviction, pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 190 of the Penal Code.

39 (f) Any person, including an applicant or provider as defined in Section 14043.1,
40 or billing agent, as defined in Section 14040.1, who has engaged in any of the
41 activities subject to fine or imprisonment under this section, shall be subject to the
42 asset forfeiture provisions for criminal profiteering.

1 (g) Pursuant to Section 923 of the Penal Code, the Attorney General may
2 convene a grand jury to investigate and indict for any of the activities subject to
3 fine, imprisonment, or asset forfeiture under this section.

4 (h) The enforcement remedies provided under this section are not exclusive and
5 shall not preclude the use of any other criminal or civil remedy. However, an act
6 or omission punishable in different ways by this section and other provisions of
7 law shall not be punished under more than one provision, but the penalty to be
8 imposed shall be determined as set forth in Section 654 of the Penal Code.

9 **Comment.** The former first sentence of Section 14107(d) is continued without substantive
10 change in Penal Code Section 17588. A cross-reference to Penal Code Section 17585 has been
11 added. The former second sentence of subdivision (d) is redundant and is not continued. See
12 Penal Code Section 1170.1(e).
