2015 Legislative Program (Status Report)

The attached table summarizes the status of the Commission's¹ 2015 legislative program. The staff will supplement that information orally, if necessary, at the upcoming meeting.

OTHER LEGISLATION OF INTEREST

Senate Bill 690 (Stone), as amended on April 6, 2015, would amend existing Penal Code Section 637.7. That provision makes it a misdemeanor to use an electronic tracking device to determine the location or movement of a person (subject to exceptions for law enforcement and consent).

The reforms that would be made in the bill are essentially identical to those suggested by the staff on pages 5-7 of the First Supplement to Memo 2015-3.

If the bill is enacted in its current form, it will not be necessary to consider those reforms any further. The staff will monitor the bill's progress.
