

Memorandum 2023-14

2023 Legislative Program (Status Report)

This memorandum provides an update on the Commission's 2023 Legislative Program.¹

Stock Cooperatives and Revocable Transfer on Death Deeds

Assembly Bill 288 (Maienschein) would implement the Commission's recommendation on *Stock Cooperatives and Revocable Transfer on Death Deeds* (Feb. 2022). It has been set for hearing by the Assembly Committee on the Judiciary on March 21, 2023.

Administrative Subpoena

Assembly Bill 522 (Kalra) has been introduced to implement the Commission's recommendation on *State and Local Agency Access to Electronic Communications: Notice of Administrative Subpoena* (Mar. 2022). It has been referred to the Assembly Committee on Privacy and Consumer Protection.

Fish and Game

Assembly Bill 1760 (Committee on Water, Parks, and Wildlife) has been introduced to implement the Commission's recommendation on *Fish and Game Law: Technical Revisions and Minor Substantive Improvements (Part 3)*.

Trial Court Unification

The Assembly Committee on Judiciary has agreed to include the following recommendations in a committee bill:

- (1) *Statutes Made Obsolete by Trial Court Restructuring: Part 8* (Jan. 2022).
