## First Supplement to Memorandum 2023-14

## 2023 Legislative Program (Status Report)

This supplement provides further information about the Commission's 2023 Legislative Program.<sup>1</sup>

## Stock Cooperatives and Revocable Transfer on Death Deeds

Assembly Bill 288 (Maienschein) would implement the Commission's recommendation on *Stock Cooperatives and Revocable Transfer on Death Deeds* (Feb. 2022).

The California Land Title Association ("CLTA") suggested revising proposed Probate Code Section 5660 as follows:

(b) A claim that a revocable transfer on death deed is inoperative pursuant to this section is grounds for shall be brought as a contest under Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 5690).

CLTA was concerned that the current language in the bill could be read as permissive, *allowing* a conflicting interest claim to be brought under the existing law that governs "contests," rather than *requiring* that treatment. The staff will explain the suggestion more fully at the March 16, 2023 meeting.

The staff sees no problem with that proposed amendment and agrees that it would make the intended meaning of the provision clearer. The amendment will likely be made when the bill is heard by the Assembly Committee on Judiciary, on March 21, 2023. If so, the Commission should consider whether to make a conforming change to its recommendation (which has not yet been put into final form).
