2023 Legislative Program (Status Report)

This memorandum provides a further update on the Commission's 2023 Legislative Program.¹

Earlier this year, a bill to implement the Commission's most recent recommendations on Trial Court Restructuring² was introduced as Assembly Bill 1757 (Committee on Judiciary).

On June 12, 2023, that bill was amended to remove the Commission's content and replace it with other content. The staff expects that the Commission's content will be amended into another Judiciary Committee bill, Assembly Bill 1756. This should not be an obstacle to enactment.
