- Commission considered Memorandum 2019-27, discussing 4 Commission's 2019 Legislative Program. No Commission decisions were 5 required or made. 6

STUDY E-200 — RECODIFICATION OF TOXIC SUBSTANCE STATUTES

Cumulative Draft

- 9 The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-33, presenting a cumulative draft of the material that the Commission has considered to date. 10
- The Commission decided that issues raised at the meeting by Commissioner 11 12 McAllister will be discussed in the next memorandum that presents a cumulative
- draft. 13

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Chapter 3 and Chapter 4 of Part 2 14

- The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-34, presenting a draft of 15 Chapters 3 and 4 of Part 2 of the proposed new Division 45 of the Health and 16 Safety Code. 17
- The Commission provisionally added the restatement of Health and Safety 18 19 Code Section 25358.1 to the list of substantive issues for possible future study, as described in the Staff Note on page 3 of the proposed legislation. 20
 - The Commission provisionally approved the inclusion of the material contained in the proposed legislation in a future tentative recommendation.

STUDY G-400 — CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT CLEAN-UP 23

The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-31 and its First Supplement, presenting a draft of a tentative recommendation to recodify the California Public Records Act ("CPRA") in a more user-friendly manner, without substantive change. Subject to the following decisions, and approval of their implementation by the Chair and/or Vice-Chair, the Commission approved that draft as a tentative recommendation, to be broadly circulated for comment:

• The title of Article 2 of Chapter 3 of Part 2 of proposed new Division 10 of Title 1 of the Government Code should be "Social Security Numbers and Related Matters."

- In the continuation of the CPRA index, proposed Section 7930.100 should refer to the constitutional right of privacy (Cal. Const. art. I, § 1). The preliminary part (narrative portion) of the tentative recommendation should mention this matter.
- When the Commission next considers new topics and priorities, the staff should raise the possibility of reviewing the codes for additional provisions to include in the CPRA index.
- The operative date of the proposed recodification should be July 1, 2021.
- The conforming revisions for the proposed recodification will be in a separate tentative recommendation.
- The staff should make the revisions listed in the First Supplement to Memorandum 2019-31.

(Commissioner Boyer-Vine was not present for the discussion of this study.)

STUDY J-1405 — STATUTES MADE OBSOLETE BY TRIAL COURT RESTRUCTURING (PART 6): COURT FACILITIES

The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-36, which presents and analyzes the comments on the tentative recommendation on *Statutes Made Obsolete by Trial Court Restructuring (Part 6): Court Facilities.*

The Commission discussed the concerns relating to the proposed amendment of Government Code Section 76101.5 in the tentative recommendation. The Commission decided not to include that amendment in its final recommendation. The Commission will revisit the matter at a later time.

The Commission also discussed the Comment for the proposed amendment of Government Code Section 70624 in the tentative recommendation. The Commission decided to revise that Comment as follows:

Comment. Section 70624 is amended to add a sunset clause, which is intended to afford time for resolution of issues relating to closure of the Courthouse Construction Fund for San Bernardino County.

(Commissioners Hallinan and King voted against that decision.)

The draft recommendation attached to Memorandum 2019-36 already incorporates both of the revisions described above. The Commission approved

- that draft as a final recommendation, for publication and submission to the
- 2 Governor and the Legislature.

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- 3 STUDY L-3032.1 REVOCABLE TRANSFER ON DEATH DEED: FOLLOW-UP STUDY
- The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-28 and its First Supplement, presenting a staff draft of a tentative recommendation regarding revocable transfer on death deeds ("RTODD"). Subject to the following decisions, and approval of their implementation by the Chair, the Commission approved that
- 8 draft as a tentative recommendation, to be broadly circulated for comment:
 - The proposed law should include a provision that requires a beneficiary of an RTODD to provide notice to the transferor's heirs, along the lines of the language that was set out on page 3 of Memorandum 2019-18. The beneficiary should also be required to record an affidavit that affirms having given the required notice. The 120-day periods used in the proposed amendment to Probate Code Section 5652 and in existing Probate Code Section 5694 should begin running at the time of that affidavit's recordation.
 - Language to make proposed new Probate Code Section 5676 mandatory was approved as drafted.
 - Proposed new Probate Code Section 5676 was revised to include language drawn from proposed Probate Code Section 5678(f).
 - Proposed Probate Code Section 5678 was revised to include language along the following lines: "For the purposes of Section 11420, any reimbursement under this section shall be deemed an expense of administration." (Commissioner Miller-O'Brien voted against this decision.)
 - (Commissioner Boyer-Vine was not present for the discussion of this study.)

Study L-4100 – Nonprobate Transfers: Creditor Claims and Family Protections

The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-30, presenting a draft recommendation to reform Probate Code Sections 13550 and 13551, which impose liability on a surviving spouse for a decedent's debts.

The Commission approved the draft as a final recommendation, for publication and submission to the Governor and the Legislature.

(Commissioners Boyer-Vine and Hallinan were not present when this decision was made.)

STUDY T-100 — TECHNICAL AND MINOR SUBSTANTIVE CORRECTIONS

- The Commission considered Memorandum 2019-37, discussing public comment on the possible obsolescence of provisions of the California Salmon Marketing and Development Act. The Commission decided to table study of that matter without further action. (Commissioners Boyer-Vine and Hallinan were not
- 6 present when this decision was made.)

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
