14 STUDY G-400 — CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT CLEAN-UP

15 The Commission considered Memorandum 2021-54, discussing follow-up
16 legislation relating to the recodification of the California Public Records Act. No
17 Commission action was required or taken.

18 STUDY J-1408 — STATUTES MADE OBSOLETE BY TRIAL COURT
19 RESTRUCTURING (PART 9)

20 The Commission considered Memorandum 2021-56, which discusses whether
21 to propose legislation to expressly clarify the jurisdictional classification of a
22 drug asset forfeiture proceeding.

23 The Commission asked the staff to do the following for its next meeting:

- 24 (1) Prepare a draft of a tentative recommendation to implement the
25 suggestion from attorney Mark Lomax.
- 26 (2) Formally solicit input from the Chair of the Committee on
27 Revision of the Penal Code regarding whether the Commission
28 should go forward with this project.
- 29 (3) Report back to the Commission (orally or in writing) about what
30 position the Committee Chair takes.

31 STUDY L-3032.5 — STOCK COOPERATIVES
32 AND REVOCABLE TRANSFER ON DEATH DEEDS

33 The Commission considered Memorandum 2021-55 and its First Supplement,
34 discussing a staff draft recommendation on *Transfer on Death Registration of*
35 *Interest in Stock Cooperative* and related issues. The Commission did not approve

1 the draft as a final recommendation. Instead, the staff will do further work on the
2 question of whether the recordation rule in Probate Code Section 5652(b) is
3 operationally necessary.

4 The Commission decided that the application of Probate Code Section 21134
5 to a revocable transfer on death deed will not be addressed in this study. Instead,
6 the Commission will conduct a separate study of that issue and of a related
7 matter, the source of the alternative pecuniary gift that is provided under that
8 section.
