## Statutes Made Obsolete by Trial Court Restructuring: Part 4

## **Request for Public Comment**

The Law Revision Commission seeks public comment on a tentative recommendation proposing revision of a number of statutes to reflect trial court restructuring and correction of related statutes with minor substantive defects. The tentative recommendation addresses the following areas:

- Municipal court action specifying the number, qualifications, or compensation of municipal court officers or employees (Gov't Code § 71617).
- Transfer of a case based on a lack of subject matter jurisdiction (Code Civ. Proc. § 396).
- Statutes made obsolete by implementation of the fiscal provisions of the Trial Court Funding Act of 1985 (Gov't Code §§ 16265-16265.7).
- Jurisdiction over a minor charged with certain motor vehicle offenses (Veh. Code §§ 40200-40230, 40502; Welf. & Inst. Code § 603.5).
