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Emergency-Related Reforms: Common Interest Development Meetings Request for Public Comment

The California Law Revision Commission seeks public comment on a tentative recommendation relating to the use of teleconferencing to conduct meetings in a common interest developments during a declared emergency.

Existing law provides that a common interest development can only conduct a board meeting by teleconference if at least one physical location is held open for participation by the owners of separate interests, with one representative of the board attending in person.

That kind of social gathering may be impracticable or even dangerous during an emergency.

The tentative recommendation proposes waiving the physical location requirement during a declared emergency, provided that certain procedural requirements are met, to ensure that members have a meaningful opportunity to participate in the meeting.

The Commission often substantially revises its recommendations as a result of public comment. To receive timely consideration, comments should be submitted by **November 1, 2020**.

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
