## MEMORANDUM 2025-20

## Terminology Relating to Persons with Disabilities (Status Report)

The Legislature enacted AB 1906 in 2024, which added Section 8290.7 to the Government Code and directs the Commission<sup>1</sup> to study and recommend nonsubstantive replacement of the terms "dependent adult" and "dependent person" throughout California codes with more respectful terminology.<sup>2</sup>

Section 8290.7 also directs the Commission in conducting this study to convene and obtain input from a working group comprised of two specifically identified agencies, along with two more broadly described categories of stakeholders.<sup>3</sup>

At the last Commission meeting, the staff indicated it would begin work on the assigned study by forming this working group and thereafter conducting a series of meetings to discuss how to best fulfill the study objectives.<sup>4</sup> The staff has since pursued a number of avenues to identify and confirmed the participation of multiple organizations in the group and expects to begin meeting with these participants within the next few weeks.
